



Dear Sir:

I enclose herewith a letter received from the Reverend Principal of Alberni Indian Residential School relative to linoleum on the basement floor of this institution.

On enquiry of Mr. Leigh of the Fred Beatty Company, I find that the basement dining room referred to was in their contract, but that at the time they had their crew over at the school they were unable to attend to this particular floor for the reason that the use of the dining room could not be discontinued, there being no other accommodation for the pupils owing to the fact that the rest of the basement floor was undergoing water-proofing at the same time. The absence of the pupils on vacation will now make this possible and is being undertaken within the next few days but will necessitate returning the Company's crew from Vancouver to Alberni, an item not anticipated in their original contract which was based on the entire basement being available. It is possible the Company may seek some adjustment in this connection amounting to approximately \$50.00, but this is not certain.

It was found by the Company that the old linoleum taken up had been damaged to the extent of requiring an additional amount 35' x 6' for replacement, regarding which I wired you on the 29th ultimo, securing your approval on the same date. The cost is \$68.97 F.O.B. the school.

The Company's representative informs me that when the hot water heating system was installed no provision was made for expansion or contraction, with the result that when it was closed down for the summer the contraction opened up some of the joints, causing a leakage which aggravated the damp floor condition.

Dear Major MacKay: Re Linoleum in Student Dining Room:

I regret to advise you that the Linoleum in the Student Dining Room is going just the same as that which has been re-laid in the Play Rooms and Basement Corridors. This Lino was, or seemed to be, in so much better shape than that in the above areas that I thought it would be alright. It was not until the last couple of months that it seemed to go so badly. In one place, I only found this week just before the Fred M. Beatty men came over. There was one long overlap along the seam under the tables on the North Side of the Dining Room which has only been saved from breaking by the fact that it is under the tables and does not have the traffic which is the case with the area along the aisle between the tables. Lately there has come a "bulge" right in the centre of the aisle leading in from the girls' side and this will likely break if not attended to.

The spot mentioned as being discovered last week, is just below the joint in the heating pipe running along the south wall. This leak is due doubtless to the fact that the hot water system is not needed for heating, and these particular joints may have been none too good at any time. But when the pipe has contracted it has caused a small "drip". This has got under the linoleum and the cement has rotted. While this particular spot is not large, and has only come during the last week, still it all adds on to the general condition. The Linoleum in both kitchens seems to be standing up very well as there is a lot of heat in both areas.

As I have said above, this is not true of the Student Dining Room and I have to advise that if something is not done about it, the linoleum here will either perish or be broken. While funds are, I know, difficult to obtain, it would be money well spent to take care of this need as soon as possible.

I called the attention of Mr Leigh of the Fred M. Beatty Co. to the

condition and he took measurements of the area concerned and ought to be able to give you a figure as to cost were it possible to undertake the work.

If this is possible, it would be well to have the work done within the next two or three weeks to have everything in shape for the re-opening of School at the end of August.

I may say that the men who are damp proofing the play rooms and basement corridors seem to have done a good job. The linoleum will be relaid right away and I hope the job will be most satisfactory.

Regretting to have to inform you as above, and trusting that it may be possible to have the work undertaken in the not too distant future, I am,
