Memorandum:

MR. BAILEY

I attach account amounting to \$200.00 covering the cost of repairing the kelvinator at the Cecilia Jeffrey Indian Residential School. The Indian Agent reported that in order to have the kelvinator functioning properly immediate repairs were necessary and he was authorized to have these done by the Cheyne Electric Company who had previously repaired the machine and were familiar with conditions at the school.

Since making the repairs the Cheyne Electric Company has gone into liquidation and an order has been received from them to pay the amount to the J. H. Ashdown Hardware Company, Winnipeg, Manitoba. Purchase order should, therefore, be made out in their favour. The coding is 461-76-09-615.

Memorandum:

MR. BAILEY

I have your memorandum of the 2nd instant in connection with the repairs amounting to \$200.00 to the kelvinator at the Cecilia Jeffrey Indian Residential School.

This school is located near the town of Kenora, Ont., and has a pupilage of 145. There is a staff of 16 persons which make a total number of 161 persons for whom food has to be provided. The school is located in an area where agricultural possibilities are limited and as a result the Principal has to buy food in a wholesale manner and consequently has to have considerable space in one refrigeration plant to keep this food from spoiling. The kelvinator unit at the Cecilia Jeffrey School was purchased on June 1, 1929, from the Campbell Heating Company, Kenora, Ont., at a cost of \$1723.00. The kelvinator is 7 feet wide, 7 feet long and 8 feet high. Its construction is described as follows:

"Built of one thickness of "V" joint, one thickness of paper, 4" of cork board, another thickness of paper and another thickness of "V" joint board."

We have reviewed our records and find that previous to the recent expenditure of \$200.00 the only other expenditures for repairs were the accounts to which you refer; namely, \$43.07 on July 30, 1933, and \$91.25 on October 25, 1933.

Dear Sirs,-

On September 7th, 1939, the Indian Affairs Branch of the Department of Mines and Resources, Ottawa, accepted the offer of Cheyne Electric of Kenora, Ontario, to make some necessary repairs to the refrigerating equipment in the Cecilia Jeffrey Indian Residential School, Kenora, Ontario, at a cost not to exceed \$200.00.

Mr. Cheyne, operating under the trade name of Cheyne Electric, Kenora, forwarded an order to the Indian Affairs Branch to the effect that the amount, namely, \$200.00, covering the cost of the above repairs, be paid to the J.H.Ashdown Hardware Company, Limited, of Winnipeg, Man., the firm from whom the repair parts were obtained. This office advised the Indian Affairs Branch that, as the order was not submitted on the proper departmental forms, we could not act on it but would, on receipt of properly certified vouchers, issue the cheque in payment in favour of Cheyne Electric and forward it to the J.H.Ashdown Hardware Company, Limited, Winnipeg. Subsequently the Indian Agent at Kenora enclosed a newspaper clipping to the Indian Affairs Branch, Ottawa, reading to the effect that Cheyne Electric had made an assignment to the Canadian Credit Men's Trust Association Limited, of Toronto. No official notice of this assignment has been received in the Indian Affairs Branch, Ottawa, from the Canadian Credit Men's Trust Association Limited.

Dear Sir;

The Principal of the Cecilia Jeffrey Indian Residential School phoned me up about 7. p.m. last night and informed me a bad break had occurred in the main water pipe line from the pumphouse to the school, and that it must be repaired immediately and that the cost for temporary repair of the line would not cost at the most more than \$100.00. He also informed me that the Engineer Mr Rose and the men who were doing the work at the last repair noticed that the pipes were badly pitted.

Mr Byers informs me Mr Rose said he would make a report as to the state of the pipes.

The distance from the school to the pumphouse is about 600 feet, and Mr Byers estimates it would cost in the neighbourhood of \$2.00 a foot, to do the digging and put in new pipe, but I anticipate it would cost more, particularly as the ground is frozen although it is only sandy soil.

The Principal suggests we should put in a new line and leave the present one as it is.

They are getting some water at the school through the present pipe line but there is considerable leakage and it ~~is~~ necessitates much pumping, and of course might fail at any time.

Some saving might be made if no foreman was hired and the work paid for on a day basis, the Principal says he could supervise the work, and I would suggest some of the pupils might do some of the digging, although I am afraid Mr Byers might not like me suggesting this to him.

"The distance from the school to the pumphouse is about 600 feet, and Mr. Byers estimates it would cost in the neighbourhood of \$2.00 a foot, to do the digging and put in new pipe, but I anticipate it would cost more, particularly as the ground is frozen although it is only sandy soil.

"The Principal suggests we should put in a new line and leave the present one as it is.

"They are getting some water at the school through the present pipe line but there is considerable leakage and it necessitates much pumping, and of course might fail at any time.

"Some saving might be made if no foreman was hired and the work paid for on a day basis, the Principal says he could supervise the work, and I would suggest some of the pupils might do some of the digging, although I am afraid Mr. Byers might not like me suggesting this to him.

"I shall be glad to receive your instructions."

The Agent has been authorized to arrange for the temporary repairs at a cost of \$100.00.

You will note from his letter that the Principal of the school considers that a new pipe line at an approximate cost of \$1200.00 is required. No funds are available for this purpose at the present time but if the work is absolutely necessary it is hoped that funds can be secured as soon as Parliament re-assembles. In the meantime I believe it would be advisable to have one of your engineers visit Kenora in order to make certain that a new pipe line is required and submit a report for our consideration.



Dear Sir:

I have your letter of the 11th instant enclosing letter received from the Principal of the Cecilia Jeffrey Residential School with reference to allowing the Public Grocery to use the basement of the old barn at the Cecilia Jeffrey Indian Residential School.

From time to time requests reach the Department from outsiders to use buildings situated on residential school property and which are not at the time required for residential school purposes. It has not been our policy to favourably consider such requests as due to present conditions it is felt that it is preferable to reserve buildings located on residential school property for the purpose of the school and thus avoid many complications that might arise if outsiders had free access to Indian residential school property. Consequently you should inform Mr. Byers that the Department is not prepared to give favourable consideration to the request of the Public Grocery.
