Sir,

I have departmental letter of September 13th, and note that there seems to be some misunderstanding in connection with this matter of the projection room for moving picture machine at St. George's Residential School.

According to instructions given by the Boiler Inspector, and to live up to the Compensation Board's regulations, this ash hoist has to be built anyway, and would cost approximately \$314.50, as per letter from Mr. H. W. Stewart, which was returned.

The Rev. Principal, though, suggested that this be built out of lumber and that it be extended up an extra six feet, and the cost of this would be trivial, as the roof would have to be built over it anyway, and thus make a moving picture projection room out of it, by lining this extra height with gyproc (a fireproof material). It would do no harm built of lumber, as it is on the back of the building and could be painted red and would never be noticed.

The Rev. Principal, Mr. Lett, objects to using the New England funds for this purpose, as this ash hoist has to be put in to comply with the Compensation Board's regulations, and should have been built with the building when it was erected.

Trusting that this fully explains the matter and that the Department will be able to have this done as the Workmen's Compensation Board is wanting to know what is being done in the matter, and if an accident occurred we would get no compensation,

Dear Mr. Graham,

As it is drawing near to the Winter months and the Department has done nothing regarding the changing of the heating system in the two wings, the Residence and the Chapel, and if we are to get through the Winter without this, some changes are very necessary in order to save fuel consumption and unnecessary freezing of radiators and pipes in the Chapel. Resulting from last year's freeze up we have some breakages to take care of now. This freeze up could not have been avoided as there was no valve in the steam pipe running to the Chapel, hence the necessary repairs that now demand our attention. This valve would close off the line so that there would be no further fear of a freeze up as we could then cut off the Chapel and have no further bother.

Personally, I am trying not to think of the possibility of having, again this Winter, to use the Auditorium for my Services and having no heat in the Residence.

Last year the consumption of fuel was rather great and unnecessary expense could be saved if the heating system were changed.

If the Department could see fit to make this alteration I should be glad, otherwise I must ask for the installation of a valve which is very necessary in order to prevent further damage being done through frost.

Please take this matter to the Department and kindly urge them to make the necessary alteration, if it is possible, or to allow the valve to be put in and make the repairs necessary to the Chapel radiators and pipe lining.

Sir:-

Principal of St. George's Residential School, in connection with the inefficient heating system in said school, and you are aware that we had considerable correspondence over this last winter, as the school was certainly in a deplorable state as heat could not be taken to the residence or to the chapel.

The Rev. Principal advises that he had been corresponding with Mr. Gardiner-Smith over this all summer, and had been expecting him right along to come to make the necessary changes, but up to this time he has not appeared, and the winter is fast closing in on us now, so naturally he, the Rev. Principal, is getting very anxious about it.

I trust that the Department will have something done very soon to rectify this trouble. The residence especially might as well be without heating as to be as it is at present.







I have to report upon the Lytton Agency No.5
as follows:-

I have inspected St George's Residential School twice this year. At my last visit there were 171 children registered. The dust question seems to be a hard one to solve as every wind that blows brings it in. Considerable oiling of the playgrounds, along with belts of poplar trees round the school, seems to be the only solution. The children were having for their next meal the evening one, gingerbread, apples and stewed pears. I was assured that they were having at least two pints of milk apiece per diem. The dish and food heater in the kitchen was disconnected. Apparently there was something wrong. I instructed Mr. Graham to have the matter investigated as it seemed a pity to have such a useful and costly piece of kitchen furniture lying idle. The fire extinguishers were still lying about as complained of by me last year, and I therefore asked Mr. Graham to urge the principal when he returned to have them placed upon brackets. I went over the classrooms and formitories and found all in order.




