I desire to refer to your letter of September 7th with reference to the report on the examination of the water at the above mentioned school.

Enclosed for your information is a copy of a memorandum received from the Lands & Development Services Branch and also a copy of a letter which that Branch has forwarded to the Department of National Health and Welfare.

I desire to draw your particular attention to the following sentence:

"It is understood a third chlorinator was salvaged by Indian Affairs at the same time from the Airport, and it is suggested that Mr. Rice be requested to locate this third unit if available for possible use at the Residential School, and let us have a description with factory numbers in case it is decided the water should be chlorinated for safety."

Please let us have this information as soon as possible.



A memorandum has been received from the Superintendent of Education regarding your recent telegram in which you requested cancellation of an order for 300 bags of cement for the Shubenacadie Indian Residential School, stating that you have sufficient cement on hand for this job.

The Superintendent of Education is prepared to reimburse the Welfare Appropriation for the value of the cement used and in order that the necessary financial adjustment between the two Divisions may be made I would request that you submit a voucher in duplicate similar to the sample attached just as soon as you know how many bags of cement will be required for the Residential School. When this voucher is submitted to the Education Division a copy of the same should be forwarded direct to the Welfare Division for purposes of record.

It is presumed that the cement you have on hand was that purchased from the Canada Cement Company in Montreal on Purchase Order No. 42853. If so, this fact should be stated on your voucher covering the transfer. It will be noted that the price charged was \$3.29 per barrel (4 bags). The Welfare Division took advantage of the 10% per barrel discount offered by the vendors for payment of the account within 20 days from date of shipment and this discount should be passed on to the Education Division in computing the cost of the cement transfer.


MEMORANDUM

In reference to the above and your letter of the 14th instant, the area was visited on Friday, the 16th, when in conjunction with Father Mackey and Mr. Rice, Superintendent of the Indian Reserve, conditions were gone into.

Water for the school, farm buildings, and residences is obtained from a lake located about one-quarter mile west of the school, and from which it is pumped to the buildings.

The lake is surrounded by farm lands and is said to be spring feed. A heavy algae growth margins the shore, the depth of water shallow to some 12 to 15 feet at the lower end. Cattle are pastured and watered there, swimming takes place, ice out in winter, etc., showing that the lake is accessible to the public at all times. A culvert from road ditch leads the water directly to the lake which, however, can be diverted to other side of road draining away from the lake.

The intake is some fifty feet into the lake at a depth of ten feet and supplied with screens. The pump house is located three hundred yards from it, near the stables, dairy, barns, etc., and if connections not water tight might become source of pollution.

Father Mackey stated some months ago that analysis of water showed M.P.N. of 3.7 and latterly 7.7, and is also unpalatable because of certain alkalies.

Deep drilling for water in this ^{area} has not proved satisfactory, as salt water is encountered. Shallow wells, this being a dry year, have mostly dried up.

The distance to source of ^{other} available water is about four miles to the reserve or in other direction to springs.

On account of expense and other difficulties, these supplies are not recommended till further examination, but it is suggested that copper sulphate be used twice a year to free lake from algae, and that a chlo-

erator be installed.

As the lake lies almost wholly within private property, it would be impossible to prohibit grazing and watering of cattle or to exclude the public.

Analysis of water samples will be followed shortly, as also photos of area.

With reference to the report dated September 19, 1949, on the sanitary survey of the above water supply made by the Public Health Engineering Division and referred to this Division from your office, it is noted that a chlorinator installation is suggested. Also suggested is the use of copper sulphate twice a year to free the lake from algae.

The estimated cost of supplying and installing a suitable hypochlorinator for this system is \$500.00. If the chlorinator mentioned in the last paragraph of our memorandum of September 15th is available and suitable for this purpose, the cost will, of course, be considerably less. The cost of repairing and replacement of parts for the hypochlorinator salvaged for the Tobique water supply system was approximately \$155.00 including freight, which may be considered as an estimate of cost for repair of a similar salvaged hypochlorinator for the Shubenacadie installation. With an allowance for installation the total estimated cost, using a salvaged unit if available and suitable, would be approximately \$230.00.

Further action on this matter will be taken on your advice.

A copy of the report on the sanitary survey at Shubenacadie Residential School is enclosed for the information of Indian Affairs.


