

Dear Mr. Ashbridge:

This is to advise you that the two ironer ends, No. 2842-R and 2842-L from the Beaver Laundry Company, have been received and are now at the school.

These ends are in blank, only the main shafting holes being drilled. It will be necessary to take the mangle apart and set it on the new ends to mark them for fitting. Seventeen holes will have to be drilled on the right end and thirteen holes on the left end. These holes will have to be tapped as well to take the brackets and fittings. As the machine will have to be taken down, levelled and squared for setting up before these holes can be marked and drilled, it will take at least two days work. The job ought to be done at a time when it would inconvenience laundry work as little as possible. As some of these holes are from 5/8" to 11/16" it will take a heavy electric drill and we have not got such equipment, although it might be possible to rent it.

I would be glad if you would advise Major MacKay that these ends have come, and I shall await further instructions.

MEMORANDUM

Mr. J.W. McCutcheon

We have had considerable correspondence with the Beaver Laundry Machinery Company, Toronto, Ont., regarding the damage to an Ironer supplied and installed with other laundry equipment on Purchase Order No. 3105. As a result of this correspondence, we wrote Beaver Laundry Machinery Company Limited on the 4th January as follows:

"Reply to your letter of the 11th ultimo, regarding condition of Ironer supplied on P.O. 3105 has been deferred pending receipt of additional information from our western representatives.

"Instead of replacing the Ironer originally supplied in accordance with my letter of Oct. 10, 1940, it will be satisfactory to this Department if you will arrange as follows:

- (a) Damaged frames to be replaced by new ones by your company without cost to this Department.
- (b) The roller which was bent as a result of the accident to the Ironer, and had to be straightened, to be replaced by your company provided it gives any trouble within the twelve months' period covered by your guarantee against defective parts.

Kindly arrange accordingly at your earliest convenience, so that we may arrange for payment of your account."

I have been informed by Indian Affairs Branch that the damaged frames and roller have been replaced by the company. It will therefore be in order to arrange for payment of the Ironer at \$896.40, Sales Tax included, f.o.b. Port Alberni, B.C.





Gentlemen:

With reference to your letter of February 22 regarding the ironer supplied to the Alberni Indian Residential School, I was advised by the Departmental Purchasing Agent that the following arrangements had been completed with your firm:

1. Damaged frames to be replaced by new ones by your company without cost to this Department;
2. The roller which was bent as a result of accident to the ironer and had to be straightened to be replaced by your company provided it gives any trouble within the twelve-month period covered by your guarantee against defective parts.

I am now advised by the Principal of the school that the new frames have been delivered but up to April 15 no arrangements had been made for their installation.

It would be appreciated if you would arrange to have these frames installed at an early date. The job should be done at a time when it would inconvenience laundry work as little as possible. Consequently the Principal, Rev. R.C. Scott, Alberni, B.C., should be consulted before the workmen go to the school.
