

The M/N girl a pupil at the Residential School died June 6th at the V.G. Hospital, Halifax, N.S.

The following is ~~to~~ a copy of the Hospital report. —

Admitted May 6th, a case of acute appendicitis of five days duration.

Operation on date of admission. The appendix was found acutely inflamed, surrounded by foul smelling pus and general peritonitis was present. The abscess was drained, the appendix removed and an enterostomy done.

The patient developed a left basal pneumonia. For a few days it looked as though she would recover but she gradually grew worse. The sputum gave a heavy growth of streptococci. She died June 6th.

When Josephine Smith died ~~last~~ March 1933, under similar circumstances I was criticised for not reporting the matter until some months afterwards.

I worked at the school on ~~March~~ May 15th and never knew that Miss Bernard was ill. They called me in on May 16th and found she had been treated with Epsom salts, that she had quered peritonitis and I predicted then that the case

MEMORANDUM

Mr. Buskard -

Re death of Anna Madeline Bernard
at Shubenacadie Indian Residential
School.

With reference to the above noted and in reply to your memorandum of the 11th. June, I am enclosing for the information of the Honourable the Superintendent General copies of letters from the Principal of the Shubenacadie school with regard to this matter.

This was evidently a case of appendicitis in which the diagnosis was probably delayed by the physician being called late in the case. Unfortunately this is by no means an uncommon occurrence even in private families. So often the patient is treated as a mild case of intestinal trouble before the persistence and severity of the symptoms induce the parents or guardians to call in medical assistance. This is evidently what happened in the case under review.

Whether an earlier operation would have saved the child's life or not is problematical. A formal investigation would be very unlikely to bring out further information in this case. Apparently we have all the facts available before us, and the only question at issue is whether or not the school authorities were culpably negligent in not calling in professional care earlier. In my opinion such a conclusion could scarcely be justified.


