Dear Mr. Strapp:

I have a letter from Dr. Dorey, again pointing out the advisability of purchasing an ironer for the Brandon School. You will recall that we had several letters last fall with regard to this matter, but we finally dropped it, due to the fact that Mr. Hamilton, in a letter dated September 21, 1944, stated the firm of Stanley Brock & Company were under the impression that a steam ironer cannot be operated successfully on less than 100 lbs. pressure. Dr. Dorey, evidently quoting a communication he received from you, writes as follows in his letter:-

"Mr. Strapp says that the boiler is in first-class shape; that he can carry 80 pounds of steam; and that it is possible to obtain from Stanley Brock, Ltd. of Winnipeg a rebuilt 100 inch ironer, which would be just the thing for this school."

It would be appreciated if you would again consult Mr. Hamilton on the occasion of your next visit to Winnipeg, and possibly the two of you could again interview Stanley Brock & Company. Following this interview, you might let me have complete information regarding the rebuilt 100 inch ironer which you consider would be suitable. If you can definitely assure us that there is sufficient pressure to operate it, I believe we will not have any trouble in persuading the Purchasing Branch to secure it.

Dr. Dorey also mentions additional sewing machines. We are ordering one Tailor's machine and two ordinary machines.

EXTRACT FROM REPORT OF A. G. HAMILTON, Inspector of Indian Agencies, 538 Dominion Public Building, Winnipeg, Man., following his inspection of the BRANDON INDIAN RESIDENTIAL SCHOOL, March 8, 1945.

Original on 133-0-1

1. We have been unable to get the stock barn shingled and so I instructed Mr. Strapp to immediately use the \$150.00 to purchase fence posts and forward the voucher at once.

2. Mr. Strapp is having the chairs repaired; but when the work is completed he will still be urgently in need of 50 folding chairs. I urge that these be supplied.

State Strapp

I have not been able to purchase an electric exhaust fan to be installed in the laundry window. Unfortunately these have not been available. The laundry walls are subject to extreme moisture and I am afraid the plaster will be off again if a suitable fan cannot be obtained.

3. The water situation is bad. I am afraid that sooner or later we will be faced with a serious shortage. The springs are very weak and more and more it is necessary to pump from the old well which too only has a limited supply.

Mr. Strapp has had the upright steam boiler repaired and I understand it will carry up to 100 lbs. steam pressure. This pressure is more than is required for a steam ironer, and I understand Mr. Strapp is requesting that the ironer be purchased and installed. If the present boiler will handle the ironer, I recommend the purchase.

The Reverend O. B. Strapp, principal of the Indian Residential School at Brandon, Manitoba, has asked us to write you and advise you of the reconditioned Flatwork Ironer which we have to offer for this Indian School.

The Ironer would be completely padded. The Ironer has been thoroughly reconditioned and overhauled and is an excellent machine for the work required at the Indian School. The price of this machine plus the motor is \$1000.00 F.O.B. cars Brandon.



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
