I note that the parts shown on the
enclosed account from General Steel Wares have been received.
Consequently, I cannot see why a voucher should not be issued
in favour of the firm.

As regards the charge of \$1.85 for freight,
the information on our file indicates that these parts were
shipped from Montreal to Vancouver in a pool car and conse-
quently the charge of \$1.85 is the share of the transportation
payable on our parcel of parts.

Voucher No. 234 for \$4.33, issued on
October 30, 1945, by the former Acting Agent, J. M. Barre,
covers the cost of transportation of the parts from Vancouver
to Cranbrook and is a different item altogether from the
\$1.85 charge. I think a separate voucher for \$1.50 should be
issued in favour of G. H. Cottrell, Limited, Vancouver, B.C.




I am in receipt of a request from Reverend
Father G. F. Kelly, Principal, Kootenay Indian School,
for payment of wages to a night watchman at the school.

Father Kelly points out the need for a night
watchman in an establishment entirely dependent upon
chemical fire-fighting equipment.

Starting with the month of November 1945,
Father Kelly has employed a Mr. Martin Gabor at a
salary of \$60.00 per month plus board, and he asks
that the Department render whatever financial assis-
tance is possible toward this. In explanation of the
fact that no account has been rendered earlier, Father
Kelly says that he wished to assure himself that Mr.
Gabor would prove satisfactory and would stay.

I may say that I have spoken to Mr. Gabor
and that he looks after the firing of the furnace at
night in addition to his watching duties.

I have your letter of the 21st ultimo, with reference to the request made by the Principal of the Kootenay Residential School for a grant towards the salary of a night watchman. As you know we have been allowing for several years a grant towards the salary of a night watchman at schools where it was considered a special fire hazard existed. In the Province of British Columbia we are allowing special grant at Cariboo, Christie and St. Mary's Residential Schools. This grant varies from \$35.00 to \$40.00 monthly for a period of five to six months during the winter season. Possibly, a similar grant should be made at the Kootenay school. However, it is noted that Mr. Gabor is also fireman at the school, consequently, would have to be employed in any case.






I have to refer to my letter of January 29th in connection with the overhaul of the 4 kw. generator at the Kootenay Indian Residential School, and previous correspondence regarding the supply of new batteries.

Mr. Indian Agent Boys on February 24th wired this office that the Otto engine had broken down, leaving the school without light and water and with greatly reduced heat because of lack of water pressure to the boilers. The Lister engine is at present in Vancouver being overhauled and it will not likely be completed for a week or ten days. Contrary to previous information supplied, the Petter's engine is not in operating condition, apparently requiring a new fuel pump which is not obtainable at the present time so far as is known. I have been in communication with the B.C. Equipment Company in Vancouver who advised that it was likely they could repair the Petter's engine fuel pump and I therefore wired the Indian Agent to forward the pump to Vancouver.

Mr. Boys is investigating the possibility of hiring an engine locally and attempts are being made to utilise a steam pump to pump the water.

I shall advise you on receipt of any further information and in the meantime would request that action be taken to supply the new batteries required as soon as possible and that authority be granted to overhaul the 4 kw. generator referred to.





With reference to Mr. Phelan's letter of January 3rd approving the purchase of beds and bed springs for use at the Kootenay Indian Residential School at a cost of \$240.00, I am forwarding Mr. Indian Agent Boys' letter of March 1st from which it will be noted that the seventeen springs supplied will not fit the beds for which they were ordered.

I have been in communication with Restmore Manufacturing Co. Ltd., who advise that the type of bed at the school is no longer manufactured nor is it possible to obtain springs to fit them. The Company suggests that the logical thing to do under the circumstances would be to return the springs for credit and supply 17 #631 bunks 2'6" as shown on the attached cutting, at a cost of \$6.75 each. The additional expenditure entailed will amount to \$51.00 plus return freight on the 17 springs and if the Department has funds available I would recommend that authority be granted to effect the exchange before March 31st.


