

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

MEMORANDUM:

The Deputy Minister.

A refrigerating system is required at the Coqualoctsa Indian Residential School and funds for its purchase are available in the current year's appropriation.

I enclose quotations received from Marshall-Wells B. C. Limited, and from McLennan, McFeely & Prior Limited.

I recommend that the business be awarded to McLennan, McFeely & Prior Limited at their quotation of \$455.00, plus \$77.00 for cork and hydrolene; and \$47.00 for door and jam; or a total cost of \$579.00. The school management will do the necessary work mentioned in the second paragraph of the firm's letter.

In connection with Mr. Pratt's memorandum of July 5th, requesting that Mensies Hardware Co. Ltd., Chilliwack, B. C., be given an opportunity to quote on this work, the Indian Agent wires, as follows:-

"Your telegram twelfth Mensies Hardware are authorized agents for McLennan McFeely whose tender you have and would participate in any installation for that firm - Stop - Letter from McLennan McFeely stating this being mailed you tonight"

I would appreciate receiving authority, at an early date, to proceed with the installation of the refrigerating system as this is the holiday period at the school and the work can be done more easily.

When replying, please return the quotations which I am attaching to this memorandum.

Dear Sir,-

The Department is in receipt of your letter of the 11th instant, enclosing a communication received from the Principal of the Coqualsetsa Indian Residential School with reference to the installation of a refrigerator.

Provision was made in the current year's appropriation for an amount of \$2,000 for repairs and improvements at the Coqualsetsa School during the present fiscal year. Our funds are so limited that this amount cannot be exceeded.

You may so inform the Reverend Principal and, if it is considered that the refrigerator is more necessary than other repairs and improvements, you may arrange for its purchase from a firm on the approved list, at a cost not to exceed the estimate given in your letter of the 11th instant. It is noted that the insulating of the room can be done by the school authorities at a cost not exceeding \$124.00.

It should be distinctly understood with the Principal that the total cost of the refrigerator and its installation will be deducted from the amount available in this year's appropriation. At the same time, you might discuss with him and report to the Department the manner in which you recommend that the balance of the funds be expended. It is understood, of course, that only necessary work will be undertaken.

I beg to forward you herewith, a communication received from the Reverend R. C. Scott, in which he makes a request to be supplied with a Refrigerator at Coqualeetza Indian Residential School.

A quotation and specification from Messrs. McLennan, McFeely and Prior Limited, is also attached, from which it would appear that the installation of the Refrigerator would cost \$455.00. In addition to this the insulating of the room would cost a further \$188.00, unless the School perform the work themselves, in which case the estimated cost of the insulation would apparently be \$124.00.

I do not know what funds are available for work of this nature, so the matter is passed to you for your consideration.

Dear Mr. Daunt:

I believe you have on file a letter from the Frigidaire people, McLennan, McFeely and Prior, with regard to installing a refrigerator in our School. I think too that the Kelvinator people through Marshall-Wells B.C. Limited put in a bid some time ago. On looking up our files I find the Marshall-Wells quotation was put in under date of August 26, 1935, at a total cost of \$852 complete. Davies and Logan of Chilliwack are the local representatives. You will be able to compare this figure with the one handed in by the Frigidaire people, for whom Menzies Hardware is the local representative.

I would like to emphasize again our need of such a plant. With four hundred pounds of milk a day to be taken care of and most of it used in the School, it is essential that we have proper facilities for taking care of this and other perishable foods. Now that we have a Milk House at the Barn, I intend to put in a Aerator by means of which the milk would be brought down at once from 95 degrees to a temperature as near 50 degrees as possible. Then if it were put at once into our refrigerator it would mean that the milk would be kept at a temperature below the point where bacteria spread freely. This would mean a great deal to us, as there will be days within the next two months and for the first two months following the opening of School, when we will lose milk. All through the Summer this is of course particularly true.

If it is at all possible I would appreciate it very much if the Department would give this installation their favorable consideration. This matter was first referred to in an estimate prepared in August 1935. I would be glad if you would forward this letter to the Department.

In this room we will install a heavy duty air conditioning unit capable of maintaining a constant temperature of 38-40 degrees and humidity of 80-84%. Hooked up to and running this unit we will install a heavy duty twin cylinder reciprocating Frigidaire compressor. This compressor will be cooled by water and powered by a 1/3 H.P. repulsion induction Frigidaire motor. This job will be engineered to give you a constant temperature on a 100% defrosting cycle. 
