Rev. Sir:

Mr. Agent Gordon states that on his recent inspection of the Cross Lake Indian Residential School he found the present bake oven badly burned out and beyond repair and recommends that a new oven be supplied.

The type of oven we supply to residential schools is that manufactured by Jean J. Daoust Limited, St. Boniface, Man., and is a wood burning oven. I enclose herewith a catalogue showing the various sizes of ovens manufactured by this firm. The Department is of the opinion that the Size No. 3 would be suitable for the requirements at this school. You will note that it has a baking space of 42 square feet, is 36" in width and 65" in height. I shall be pleased if you will inform the Department as soon as possible whether this oven would be satisfactory for your school, also if you have accommodation for same and whether its size would permit it to easily pass through the door into the room where it would be installed. When we have this information, consideration will then be given to placing an order for supplying same. You might furnish full shipping directions.

Sir:-

I beg to inform the Department that a new engine for power for the lighting plant is required at Cross Lake Indian Residential school.


In April last I drew the attention of the Department to the fact that the engine used for this purpose was unsatisfactory, being under power. However it ran along until last fall, when the crank shaft broke, ripping the bearings out of the body, breaking out large pieces of the solid body. Fortunately, a good supply of wood had already been cut, and other outside power work done, so that it was possible to move the engine which had been used outside in for the winter. The old engine is beyond repair, and would not serve satisfactorily if it could be repaired.

The school authorities express a preference for the Fairbanks Morse gasoline engine, and state that one of this make, of eight horsepower would be satisfactory. I would recommend that a new engine of the type asked for be supplied, purchased in Winnipeg, and shipped north on the first boat to Norway House, or rather addressed to The Principal, Cross Lake Indian School, Cross Lake, when it will go direct to Whiskey Jack where it will be received by the School.

The engine now in use will be required for cutting wood and other outside work even before the new one can be received.

We are informed that it will be satisfactory if the engine is shipped from Winnipeg about June 1st, next, to the address stated above, when it will go direct to Whiskey Jack. However, you are, no doubt, aware of the proper shipping directions, and will arrange to have the equipment mentioned forwarded when navigation opens.






