Memorandum:

The DEPUTY MINISTER,-

I have for acknowledgment Mr. Pratt's memorandum of December 23rd and also copy of a letter received by James A. MacKinnon, P.P., from M. Runnalls, attached thereto. Mr. Runnalls, in his letter, refers to a portion of land near St. Albert and is anxious to know if the Government would be prepared to sell this property.

I may state that the St. Albert Indian Residential School and the land surrounding this institution are the property of the church authorities. Apart from the fact that the Department pays a per capita grant to this institution, we have no ownership or control over the property at St. Albert.

In addition to the property at St. Albert, there is the farm adjoining the school known as the Edmonton Indian Residential School, operated under the auspices of the United Church of Canada. Enquiries have been made on more than one occasion with respect to the land attached to the Edmonton school and the willingness of the Government to sell a portion of this land. The Edmonton school has an enrolment of 150 pupils. The Department has always been opposed to the sale of any portion of the land known as the Edmonton Indian Residential School farm.
