I am in receipt of a letter from the Principal of Cross Lake Indian Residential School to which was attached a list of the equipment urgently required for the proper management and operation of this school:



- ✓ 1: Potatoe Peeler.
- ✓ 2: Large Washing Machine; the present and only washing machine in use measures only 28" in length and is quite inadequate for such a large school.
- 3: Ironing Machine.
- 4: Two Tailor's Sewing Machines
- 5: One Darning Singer Sewing Machine.
- ✓ 6: The present baking oven is much too small and is very old. It is a "Daoust" and is not made any more and therefore parts cannot be bought for repairs.
- 7: Two easy chairs for the infirmary would be very much appreciated.
