Dear Mr. Scott:

Rev. Mr. Hetherington, who was my assistant two years ago, organized the Boy Scouts in connection with the Brandon Industrial Institute. We have about forty members in the troop. I have gone to the expense of getting them a special Boy Scout outfit which cost \$300. My son, Fred, was appointed assistant Scout Master. Lieut. Hetherington went overseas with the 203rd Battalion, and was wounded on the 14th of April, and died on the 15th.

The boys are very anxious that they shall continue this Scout work. I have secured the assistance of a returned soldier to help in the movement, and the boys are very anxious to have a bugle band, consisting of about ten bugles and two or three drums. The cost will be in the neighborhood of \$125 or \$150. I would consider it a great favor if the Department would encourage this movement by providing these bugles and drums. Personally I am strongly of the opinion that the movement is a great help to the building up of character, and in the physical training of the boys. Favorable consideration of this request will be greatly appreciated.

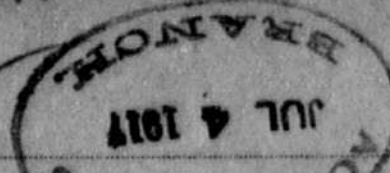
