I have to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 7th instant informing the Department that you have been unable to obtain coal for the Mount Elgin Institute and that it is impossible to obtain a supply from your regular coal dealer.

In reply I beg to say that the Department had arranged, through the Militia Department, for the purchase of one hundred and fifteen tons of coal at \$9.00 per ton (mixed stove and nut) f.o.b. Long Branch Camp, for the Mohawk Institute, and had arranged with Mr. Gordon J. Smith, Indian Superintendent, Brantford, for the shipment of the coal to that school. Mr. Smith is being wired today to have part of this coal shipped to your school.

It is hoped that this coal will arrive in good time and that you can arrange matters until its arrival. Accounts will be sent you covering the cost and delivery of the coal. You should endeavour to arrange for the delivery of the balance of the coal required from your local dealer.

Dear Mr. Scott:

I enclose you a communication addressed to the Secretary of the Department from Mr. McVitty re their needs at Muncsy. What they really require there is the Carpenter Shop fitted up. He estimates this at \$2000. I think this would make a very good job of it.

They also need a building for a Boys' Playroom, and an Assembly Hall above it. The cost of this would be about \$10,000.

The supply of drinking water, too, is not at all satisfactory. It is pumped into the Building by a hydraulic ram. The supply is not sufficient at times to keep the ram working. The result is inconvenience for the want of pure water. I have suggested to Mr. McVitty that a grant of \$500. ought to be made for the digging of a well and installing a pump. The depth of this well is quite problematic, but I think that it ought not to have to go deeper than the bed of the river for a good supply, which would be about 60 feet at the most.

There should also be a grant made of about \$500. for general repairs.

I trust that this programme will receive the best consideration possible in the next estimates.

The building is a splendid frame and if properly repaired now would serve its purpose for many years. The principal, Mr. McVitty, is a thoroughly practical man and I feel confident that the repairs, if authorized, would be carried out in a most satisfactory manner. I would, therefore, ask for your authority for the expenditure of the amount above mentioned, payment to be made from the school appropriation for the current year.



Re. Supply of Water.

As the supply of water from the south hydraulic ram has failed, it is necessary to use the water from the west hydraulic ram for drinking and culinary purposes. This supply is not adequate for all purposes, and it cannot be safely increased by the water in the stock watering tanks. The water in these tanks, though apparently excellent, I do not think that it would be safe to mix it with the water from the hydraulic rams. I would, therefore, respectfully recommend that a well be sunk in the school yard and the water from it used to supplement the water supply from the west.


