

Dear Sir:

Miss St. James writes the Department that she did not receive enough gauze in her last requisition and that some other items asked for were not supplied. On this she mentioned Hypodermic needles and syringe. It is believed that between the two schools there may be sufficient supplies of this kind on hand to last until larger regular order is sent in. I must say that the requisitions from your schools are often not very carefully made up and show little sign of examination by the medical officer. Such an item, for example as "suture sundries and forceps" gives little indication of what is required, in fact several items were deleted because it was not clear what was wanted and others such as Bicarbonate of Soda because it was scarcely thought the Department should be asked to supply it.
