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

and that he should get the work without tender, I informed

tender, but I may say the Barn was built by day labour, no

For your private information I may say Hudson told  
me he should have all the Dominion Government work, as he was  
a supporter of the Government, but I told him I was not  
influenced in this way as any work we had went to the lowest

In the absence of Dr. Duncan C. Scott from the city for a few days, I think it well to advise you that a letter has come in the mail this morning from Captain Frank Edwards, of Kenora, following up his telegram of Saturday regarding work at the Agency house. In his communication he states as follows:-





Sir,—

Referring to your letter 129-1-5 of 20th, inst. We have instructed Messrs. Kelly & Kimberley to rebuild the Bakery chimney and a new main chimney at the Kenora R.C. School.

The old main chimney will be used as a ventilating shaft and will be much more satisfactory than using the old chimney, and meets with the approval of the Principal.

The Principal informs us that that the brick work on the north west corner of the building is in bad repair and needs a few bricks and the remainder pointed, and also a little cement work done. The windows are in bad shape, the framework spreading causing a loss of heat etc.

To repair this will cost in the neighbourhood of \$125.00 and we will be glad to have authority to have this work done.

The building of the chimneys, is now underway, having been left over till the children were on holiday.

I have your letter of the 31st ultimo, informing the Department that you have issued the necessary authority to rebuild the bakery chimney and a new main chimney at the Kenora Indian Residential School, and requesting authority to incur an expenditure in repairing the brickwork on the north west corner of the building and also in repairing the framework of the windows.

In reply I have to say that the Department will approve of you incurring an expenditure not exceeding approximately \$125 in the repairs to the brickwork, windows, etc.

I have also your letter of the 30th ultimo, relative to the condition of the motor of the new water pump.

In reply I have to say that the school authorities should provide the expenditure required from their per capita grant or other receipts in the purchase of a new motor or in repairing the old motor.

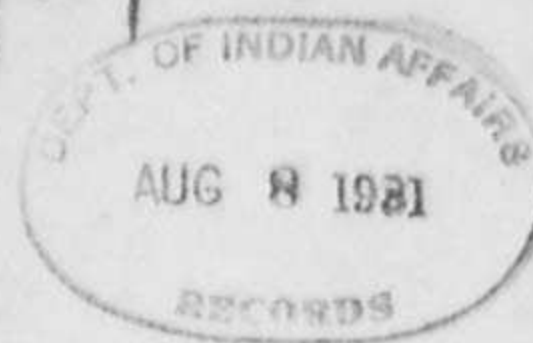
