

Gentlemen:

The Department finds it necessary to return your account, amounting to \$222.04, covering repairs to the septic tank at the Brandon Indian Residential School.

A receipt is required, showing the number of hours and the rate per hour in connection with the item of \$41.25 for labour in digging 3 manholes and also the item of \$65.55 for labour on cribbing and cement work. With regard to the items of \$25.30 for cement and \$70.09 for cribbing, the quantities and prices should be stated. This information is required by the Treasury Department before the account can be paid.



Re: Brandon Indian School.

I was again at the Brandon School on January 8th and would report as follows.

Your authority for \$150.00, file 133-0-5, dated May 13th, Mr. Strapp states has been used except for a few cents.

Authority in your letter, 133-0-5, dated May 17th for -

1. Repair to ventilators - work completed.
2. Purchase of electric fan - not obtainable here, but should be installed, when obtainable, in upper half of window.
3. The plaster has been repaired.

Authority in your letter, 133-0-5, dated June 29th,

1. Repair to septic tank at bungalow completed and vouchers sent in.
2. Manholes repaired and manhole covers provided for school septic tank. Instructed Yates to supply Mr. Strapp at once with necessary invoice.

The shingles have not yet been put on the barn. Mr. Strapp was unable to get help. I interviewed a Mr. Robinson, of Kenton, and he will try to do the work before March 10th. If by chance the weather remains too cold, and the work cannot be done I would like authority to purchase 500 tamarac posts. These are available now at Wades Lumber Company, at 31¢ for 4" tops and 37¢ for 5" tops. The fences are in very poor condition and must be repaired during the coming summer.

The houses all need exterior painting. Mr. Strapp states he cannot undertake the work and to date he has not been able to get anyone to even submit a quotation.

The folding chairs supplied for the auditorium or chapel are in poor condition; in fact, many are out of use and others are unsafe and should be discarded. This was brought to the Department's attention some months ago, but at that time apparently funds were not available. Now a strong folding chair can be obtained from the Stony Mountain Penitentiary priced at \$2.75 each. I enclose a letter from Warden Campbell dealing with this matter.

In going through the School I found a toilet in the

boys' dormitory and one in the girls' dormitory badly cracked and unsafe. These two toilets should be renewed at once. I might add that the toilets have been cracked for months, but gradually are getting worse and some pieces have loosened, thus weakening the bowl.

The taps were all in good working order, except those on the bath tubs, and the loss of water has been greatly reduced. The water situation is bad and the supply is very low.

The children appeared in good health. They were clean and well dressed.

The new kitchen matron appears capable and Mr. Strapp feels certain she will handle the department well.

Mr. Strapp is still without a qualified engineer and is doing the supervision of this work himself.

The cattle are in good condition but there is a shortage of milk and Mr. Strapp is confident he cannot get the supply necessary from the present herd. He hopes later to obtain some Holstein cows.





2. Sewing machines (I think these were to be power machines).


Mr. Strapp writes to say that nothing has come of this. He also says that the boiler is in first-class shape; that he can carry 80 pounds of steam; and that it is possible to obtain from Stanley Brock Ltd. of Winnipeg a re-built 100 inch ironer, which would be just the thing for this School.

We shall be glad if you will look into the matter of the flatwork ironer, and also the sewing machines, in order that the institution may be able to do its work more efficiently and with less wear and tear on the human side.

Your voucher No. 27, amounting to \$411.64, issued in favour of Yates & Company, included an account of \$222.04 for repairs to the septic tank at the Brandon School. This particular section of the account was returned to Yates & Company, due to the fact that it was necessary to have a receipt for the number of hours and the rate per hour in connection with the \$41.25 for labour in digging three manholes and also \$65.55 for labour on cribbing and cement work. The account should also have shown the quantities and prices for the items of \$25.30 for cement and \$70.09 for cribbing. This account should have been referred to you but for some unaccountable reason it was sent direct to Yates & Company, who may not yet have returned it with the desired explanation. It would be appreciated if you could arrange with that firm to furnish the information required and return it at the earliest possible date, in order that it may be paid.
