

I find that the Agent got a letter on July 13th and an invoice from Ingram and Bell returned saying the Dept, would not pay for the \$11.44 on the invoice. I never charged the Dept. \$11.44.

There was one item on this invoice of 805 & 6% Sales Tax .48 - \$8.53. This was for Sulparsphenaium used in the treatment of Syphilis for Irene McDonald.

Last Spring I wrote through the Agent Mr. MacKey to the Dept. that I couldn't continue giving Irene McDonald the Nonarsm(?) as her veins were so poor. Mr. McKey the Agent got a letter in reply stating that they did not carry in stock the Sulpharspheaaium but that if I secured it they would pay for it. Acting on this letter I secured the drug from Ingram & Bell. I was only charging \$8.55 which is stated on my bill and not \$11.44 which was the total of the invoice I got from Ingram & Bell (this invoice included other articles for my office). I wrote a long letter trying to make myself clear on this matter. Hope I did so.

Dear Sir:

Yesterday I sent on the account of the Halifax Infirmary ,the amount being \$ 500.00 for the twenty-six tonsil cases. Your letter of August 25th. ult. says that \$ 300.00 is the amount. Either that was a mistake on your part or you misunderstood my letter of August 18th. If I had included the word " each" in connection with the fee of the Doctors ,it would have made things clear. The arrangement was that the Doctors should divide four hundred between them and the balance go to the Hospital.

The work started on Monday morning and the twenty-six were back at the School the following Saturday,all are doing well. The cost to the School for transportation did not amount to more than fifty cents per child. On the whole it was much better than having the work done in the School.

Dear Sir:

In connection with the enclosed account of Dr. McInnis. As you see he has charged up to the School two examinations of children before the children came to the School. The matter of \$ 23.00 for John Pennal who dislocated ^{his} elbow. In the first place he was puzzled to know what happened, then when it was decided that it was a dislocated elbow, he gave the boy a whif of ether and put the elbow in place. He could not decide if anything further should be done till he had looked up his text books. That done he returns to the School to let us know that it was not necessary to put splinks on. That accounts for the two visits. He has charged several anaethetics whereas there was only one.

I do not feel that I should sign the enclosed vouchers without making the above explanation.
