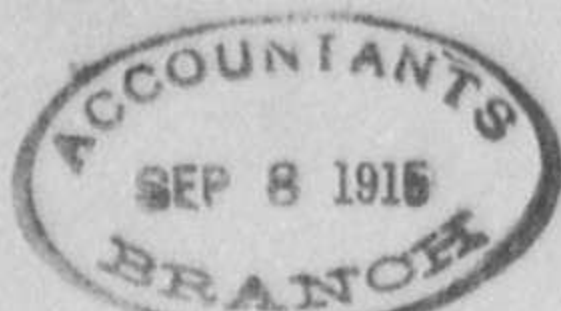

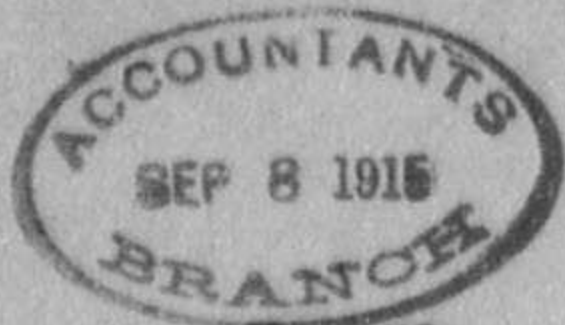

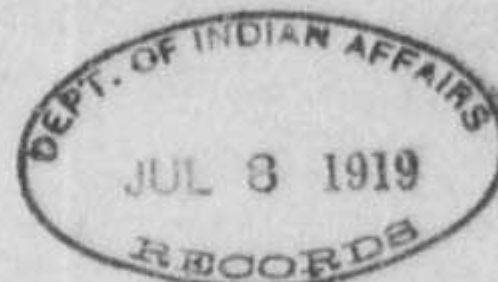

Dear Mr. Scott,-

My last report of the Cecilia Jeffrey School showed that many changes were needed to put the institution in shape for successful operation.

About that time Rev. Mr. Martin succeeded Mr. Dodds as Principal, and as soon as his appointment was made permanent, he proceeded to introduce new features, with a view to making the School more efficient.

desirable that an electric lighting plant should be introduced to complete the year's improvements. All the power that is necessary the school now has, but a ^{new} dyⁿamo with 100 light power, with wires, globes etc., can be provided at a cost of \$800.00.

The church feels that they are not able to meet this expenditure after the amount already expended is taken into account, but they will pay part if the Government will also pay part.

I recommend that under the circumstances a grant of \$500.00 be given to Principal Martin for the purpose of completing this electric light system.

Memorandum:

Mr. Scott.

A septic tank is being installed for this Department by the Greater Winnipeg Water District Commission in connection with the Cecilia Jeffrey Indian Boarding School, a plan of which has been submitted to me for examination.

I have noticed that the approximate lake level is only 9" lower than that of the bottom of the septic tank, and the outlet from the school is 7'.8, consequently if the water should rise to a height of 8' it would mean that the sewage from the septic tank would flow back into the drain pipes inside of the school. It is not mentioned on the plan whether the lake level given, that is 1060, is the highest water level. Before allowing the Commission to go any further with this work I would suggest that these facts be submitted to the Chief Engineer of the Commission in order to prevent any mistakes being made in the performance of this work.

Sir,-

With reference to the construction for this Department of a septic tank at the Cecilia Jeffrey Indian Boarding School, Kenora, Ont., by the Greater Winnipeg Water District, would you please advise me whether the lake water level which is mentioned to be 1060 on the plan for this work, number D. 508, is the highest water level. The Department has been informed lately that the water in the lake rises sometimes from eight to nine feet. If this is the case, and the data given on the plan is not the highest water level, I should think that there will be danger of the water flowing back from the tank into the drain pipes of the school, as the difference of level between the outlet of the drain pipe from the school and the bottom of the septic tank is approximately 7' 8".

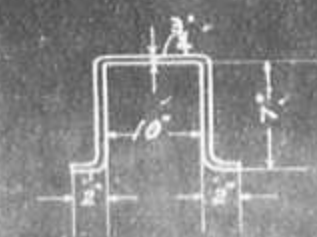

In reply to your inquiry of the 10th October, I beg to draw your attention to the History of the Levels of the Lake of the Woods, as set forth in Table 20, Page 100 of the Winnipeg River Power & Storage Investigations, - being Water Resources Paper No. 3, Vol. 1, 1915. These levels have been plotted on sheet 910, - a blueprint of which I am enclosing for your convenience. On this sheet you need pay no attention to the Greater Winnipeg Water District equation, but, for translation of the elevations given, into accurate Geodetic elevations above sea level, add 1.31 feet to the elevations shown on the sheet.

I would refer you also to the appendix to the "Hearings in Re Levels of the Lake of the Woods", by the International Joint Commission, published in 1916, pages 83 & 84, which are really quotations from the other document.

During the year 1916, and just as the decisions of the International Joint Commission with respect to the levels which are to be controlled were about to be reached, there was a flood level established, somewhat higher than those previously recorded, viz., 1064.1 feet above main sea level, Geodetic elevations.

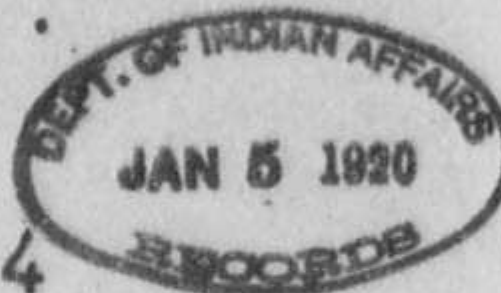

might stumble and fall with unfortunate results. Coal oil lamps
might explode any time. This has happened in many places and on
many occasions. I once more urge the department to assist the church
in avoiding possible calamity from this source.

A report has been received from Inspector Semmens on the lighting conditions at the Cecilia Jeffrey School. He states that the present system of lighting consists entirely of coal-oil lamps which are exceedingly dangerous in an institution of this kind, and recommends that an electric lighting plant be installed at an estimated cost of \$800.00. He further states that the church authorities are willing to pay \$300.00 towards the installation of a new electric lighting system providing the Department will pay the balance. If funds are available, I would recommend that some provision be made for a new lighting system for this school.

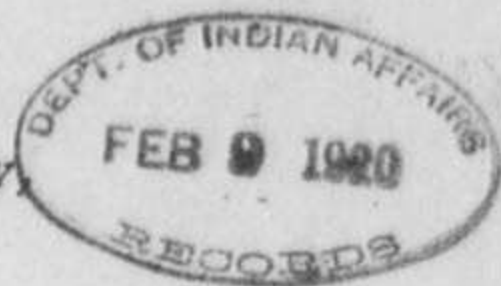
