We would do the Heating in the new Indian Residential Day School, making changes suggested by Rev. Father O'Grady, of installing the hot water heating boiler in the basement of the main building, which would give Father O'Grady the use of the ground floor of the new school for classrooms. It also makes it necessary to install a larger boiler with a Side Arm Heater to heat the domestic hot water, doing away with the storage tank, and electric unit.

Our price for the above is ELEVEN THOUSAND FOUR HUNDRED AND SIXTY EIGHT DOLLARS (\$11,468.00).

We would install the Plumbing in the new Indian Residential Day School, adding the following fixtures to the present set up:

- 6 Toilet combinations
- 4 Lavatory basins
- 2 Urinals
- 2 Drinking Fountains.

Our price for the above is FIVE THOUSAND THREE HUNDRED AND EIGHTEEN DOLLARS. (\$5,318.00).

We would carry the cold water line 2 ft. outside the building. Waste line to be carried 2 ft. outside the building.

Dear Sirs: Indian Residential School - Kamloops, B. C.

HEATING

We take pleasure in submitting our estimate for supplying hot water heating system as per plan with the exception of removing the boiler from the new school and installing in the old boiler room of the Residential school.

We would carry a 2 1/2" hot water main and return from the old boiler room to the the new building. Installing 2 - 2 1/2" circulating pumps with valves and by-passes. Only one pump would operate at a time. The other pump would be a stand-by pump in case of a breakdown. We would increase the boiler size by one section for domestic hot water supply and install an indirect hot water heater. This would take the place of the electric tank which was to be installed in the boiler room of the new school. This boiler would operate automatically summer and winter and supply hot water for the new classrooms. We would cover the return mains with 4 ply asbestos covering, install mains in cedar box between the new building and the old one. We would install a 100 lbs. Iron Fireman automatic coal stoker. We would also recommend that the chimney which would have been built at the new school be built in the corner of the old boiler house so that the new boiler would have a separate chimney.

If this heating proposal is accepted we would make the complete installation for the sum of Ten Thousand, Nine Hundred and Fifty-Seven Dollars (\$10957.00).

That the construction of this building has reached the stage where the heating system should be installed and, in this connection, the following tenders have been received:

That the Departmental Engineers recommend the acceptance of the tender of H. Giddens & Sons, of Kamloops, B.C., in the amount of \$10,957.00;


That funds are available for this purpose in Vote 230, 1949-50, Indian Affairs Branch, Department of Mines and Resources.
