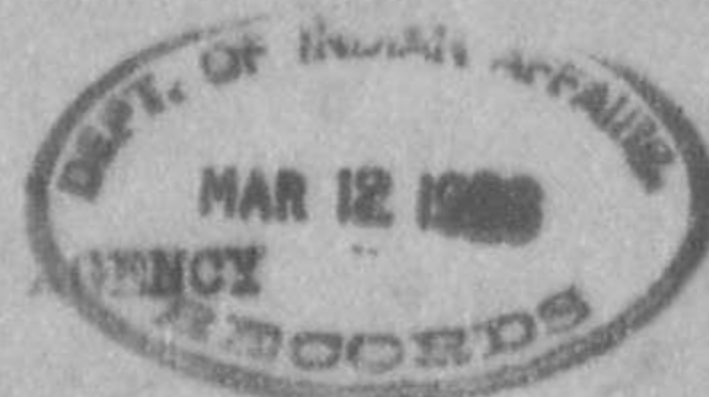



Dear Sir:-

Enclosed please find a statement from Dr Duncan for X-Ray service given Ada Esquimaux on the evening of June, 11th.

Dr Hamilton was the Dr we called upon to examine Ada, and he referred us to the X-Ray, as he could not locate the trouble, and Dr Duncan was the one in charge of the X-Ray, at the General Hospital. Dr Hamilton told me that he had asked Dr Duncan to charge us a cheap rate, as it was in his power to do so, but I think he has charged us as high as would be reasonable for any one to pay. You may know more about this than I do, but I think the charge is high.

The case was like this. I had just come from Town, and some one ran to meet me to tell me that Ada had just swallowed a pin, and that it was stuck in her throat, out of reach to allow of us getting it out, and we at once took her up to Dr McCaig. He referred us to Dr Hamilton, and he took us to the general Hospital for the X-Ray. Dr Hamilton, nor Dr Duncan could locate the pin, and we came to the conclusion that it had either come up while she was coughing at a wash bowl, or had passed down into her stomach. We watched her for a time and there was no bad effects.

Sorry to trouble you about this matter but thought it best to refer to you in this matter. Will you please let me know what your opinion is.

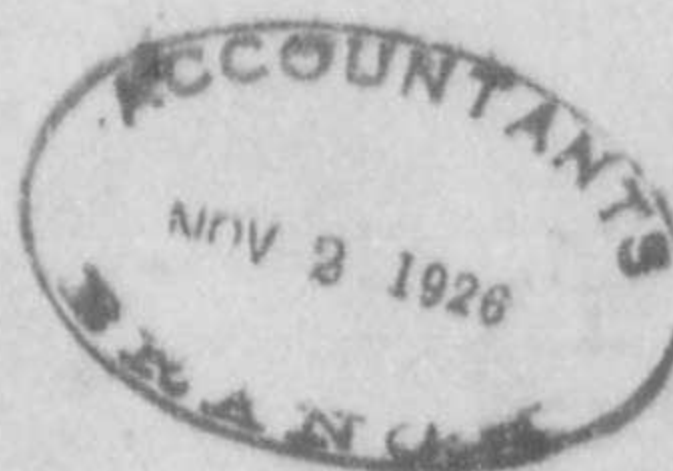



We have a pupil in our School who is by no means well.  
Olive Peters, Age 16 years. from Pottawatami, Pilbury. Ont. She has always had  
bad glands on her neck, and open sores when she came to us. She was ill  
and in bed for a short time this winter, but is up and down, some days  
feeling better, and then in bed not so well.

We have wondered if a change would  
do her good. We do not want to put the responsibility on to any one else.  
But as you know, such a case causes a lot of care and responsibility in a  
school where there are so many living together. If she is going to die, we  
would do all we could for her. But there is the question, what is best for  
concerned. Your advice will be much appreciated.

We have had a lot of sickness  
this winter, The first was a case of measles brought home from High School.  
Then the whole of our school had them, covering the space of nearly a month.  
Now we find that the result is that many of them have had colds, These  
are getting better and we hope soon to have it all cleaned up.

MEMORANDUM

Mr. Paget.

In November, 1921, the Ontario Provincial Board of Health drew to our attention the deplorable conditions in Indian homes at Stevenson, Tilbury East Township. Dr. Scott directed Mr. Abraham to make an inspection and report. Mr. Abraham reported that the Indians claim to be Pottawatamies, of the same group as Chief Caldwell. The Deputy directed that some of the children be placed in a residential school.

One of these Indians, Olive Peters, was sent to the Shingwauk Home, Sault Ste. Marie. She is now 16 years of age, and is far from well. She has always had bad glands on her neck. The Principal reports that she has been ill for a short time this winter "but is up and down, some days feeling better, and then in bed not so well".

She should be discharged from the school, and, I believe, the only suitable place for her is a hospital. Can arrangements be made?

I shall be glad, therefore, to have you correspond in the case with the Rev. Benj. G. Fuller, Principal of the Shingwauk Home, Sault Ste. Marie, Ont. The Department is writing him and telling him that he may send this girl to such institution as you may assign her with a view to necessary treatment being afforded.
