Dear Sir:-

About three years ago the tower on this school was struck by lightning and seriously damaged. At that time I pointed out to the Department the advisability of having the metal ornaments on top of each of the three towers grounded by suitable wire. No steps were taken to do so. This summer a prominent builder was visiting us and was amazed that we should allow a day to pass without having ground wires attached. We did not in any way draw his attention to the matter.

On Wednesday night last, a furious electric storm swept over this District. The main tower was struck and quite shattered. This took place in the night. Fortunately it did not catch fire, else the building would undoubtedly have been destroyed and possibly some lives lost.

We notified the Insurance Company. Repairs should be made soon as possible, and most assuredly the wiring should be done at earliest possible moment.

Dear Sir,-

The Manager of the Norwich Union Fire Insurance Society has written to me regarding the building used as an industrial and residential school by your Department situated on the Mount Elgin Industrial Farm, Township of Caradoc, County of Middlesex. I understand that this building has been struck by lightning and the Manager suggests that the building should be equipped with a lightning rod.

The rodding of buildings for protection against lightning has received attention of this Department for some time, and we are fully convinced of the adequacy of the protection thus afforded.

The loss of farm buildings in the Province of Ontario during the last two or three years has been a very serious drain upon the agricultural protion of the community. So far as the insurance people are concerned their rate is varied to meet the hazard so that it is not a material consideration from their standpoint, what the losses are. There is, however, the loss to the community from the needless destruction of property and the loss to the individual over and above the insurance because, as a rule, farm buildings are inadequately insured.

I thought I would write you regarding the matter in order that if you are considering the question you might be able to have this building more completely protected.



Re Mt. Elgin Institute.

I have been to Muncey in connection with claim for damage by lightning to the building insured under the above numbered policies. I have made arrangements with A.E. Ponsford, contractor of St. Thomas, to repair the damage immediately.

As this building was struck in precisely the same place something over a year ago I think that it would be a necessary prevaution for you to have this building properly equipped with lightning rods otherwise there might be a serious confalgration or probably loss of life as the building apparently is in an exposed position and the tower with the iron finial seems to atract lightning.

If you decide to have the lightning rods put on I would be pleased if you would advise me as soon as possible as the Insurance Companies are somewhat anxious.

I have been informed by the Rev. Mr. McVitty, Principal of the Muncey Institute, that the batteries of the Delco lighting plant are about exhausted and must be renewed. 

Reverend Sir:-

I have your letter of the 9th instant, referring to your need for a car of hard coal.

In reply I beg to state that the Purchasing Commission received prices for Anthracite Coal from Wm. Buchanan and from the Hawken Lang Coal Companies, of London, Ont. You might do well to inquire from these dealers if any is still available. If this fails you, the best procedure would be to communicate direct with the F. P. Weaver Coal Company, of 263 St. James St., Montreal, who are offering carload lots of Pennsylvania crushed Anthracite, sizes from buckwheat up to egg. The price this last firm quote is \$8.50 at the Mines in the States. If you are unsuccessful in securing the coal desired, at a later date this Department might be of some assistance. We might arrange to purchase for you, and the expenditure would be deducted from the per capita grant.

I have yours of the 9th instant, informing the Department that the Delco batteries are no longer of any value. If you will offer prices from the local agents and from the Delco Products Co., 173 King St. East, Toronto, this Department will submit them to the Purchasing Commission for a Minute number, and instructions will be given without delay. The Deputy Superintendent General has authorized this expense, in view of your urgent representation.

I5000I-5 ult. re lightning rods on this building permit me to say that when the slaters were here repairing the tower and had all scaffolding up I purchased 200' of woven copper wire from Messers Ingram & Davey, St. Thomas as per invoice and had them attach it. They were competent men. This wiring from the main tower which has been struck twice is now deeply grounded and I believe will meet the case. The cost is about one half it would have been if scaffold had been taken down.

Re Orphanage at Muncey.- When in your office on Tuesday, you will remember we discussed the matter of some provision being made for orphan Indian children in the Province of Ontario. In this connection, I intend to place before our General Board of Missions the advisability of a building being constructed on the Muncey Institute property, believing that such an institution could be managed much more economically by the staff of that Institute than by any other provision that might be made at present. The overhead charges for the managing of such an institution would be largely met by its being connected with, and under the management of the Principal of, the Muncey Institute.

I am taking this course, believing that such a proposition would meet with the approbation of the Department of Indian Affairs. If there are any objections that could be offered to this plan, would you kindly favor me with the same. Such would prevent any wrong impression being conveyed to our General Board of Missions.



Strong representations have been made to the Board of Missions of the Methodist Church relative to the desirability of providing on the Muncey Reserve a Primary Residential School for Indian children.

There are many children on the Indian Reserves in Ontario, who are too young to attend the ordinary residential schools, for whose education and care no provision has been made. Some of these are children of deceased soldiers.

When the matter of providing such a residential school was under consideration by our Board of Missions at its recent session, a resolution was passed endorsing this proposal and urging upon the Department of Indian Affairs the necessity of establishing such a school at Muncey as soon as possible.

I trust that this matter will receive the favorable consideration of the Government and that an appropriation of from \$35,000 to \$50,000 will be made at the next session of Parliament to erect such a school.

Dear Dr. Scott:-

In reply to personal letter of October 10th. re holidays, permit me to say that the practise of two months holidays at this school started during the stress of war time. I drew your attention to it, then when in Ottawa you simply nodded assent, and it has continued since then.

Holidays start July 1st. and end August 31st. Children, whose parents need them, go home, others remain here and are paid wages, girls of any size \$20. per month and boys \$30. to \$40. according to size.

The arrangement is most pleasing to the Indian but expensive to us. July and August are haying and harvest. There will be a great row if it is changed. The Six Nation spirit has permeated our entire constituency and our Indians are spoiling for a contest, especially on points of law.






