Dear Sir;

I enclose herewith the following Vouchers:-

No. 456 in favor of Smith's Drug Store for \$39.80.

I may say that the goods indicated here were ordered entirely by Doctor Williamson. Most of it in connection with his treatment of Syphilis cases. This before the supply sent from Ottawa.

No. 457 in favor of Johnston's Drug Stores for \$13.25.

Some years ago we secured a very effective Prescription for Scabies from Dr. Holmes when he was medical officer. Since then we have been using this ointment when ever necessary. It costs \$2.00 a pound.

No. 458 in favor of National Drug and Chemical Company Limited for \$17.50. This is our quarterly drug account. Which I think is very low.

No. 459 in favor of The Edmonton Paint and Glass Co. Ltd. for \$41.50. This account consists of a variety of ~~all~~ material for repairing and freshening up the school and property. We have done the ~~work~~ work with our own help. There was considerable repair work to be done after this year of having such a full school, and I wish to keep the plant in fairly good repair.

Under another cover I am sending forward the quarterly report for June 30th 1930. In the case of the two Brandon Boys who ran away on April 27th. I only counted their attendance to the date on which they left. The other cases are normal.

On July 15th I sent Elizabeth Cardinal to her father near Fort McMurray. I shall sent the account later.

The Brandon Children were returned in safety to Brandon on July 9th. Every one was in good health according to the doctor's examination. I sent to Dr. Doyle a statement of their health and any recommendations by the doctor. We have had a good year with them and nothing to regret except the six boys who deserted. I trust the Department is satisfied with our treatment.

I enclose herewith specifications and a price on installing a Frigidaire plant in the school. On June 21st 1929, letter No. 110-0-5 you wrote asking me to furnish information regarding cold storage facilities.

The enclosed plan will fit into a room just off the kitchen and by all means the most ~~convenient~~ convenient place in the building. Along with Mr. Inspector Murison I considered an outside building, but this would mean considerable expenditure, including concrete and the extensive use of ice. The cost in putting up one like they have at St. Albert would be considerably more than the cost of this Frigidaire. This would be a walk-in cupboard and quite up to date. The recent installation of the Calgary Powey has also made it possible to install this new system with economy.

I asked the company to include all costs in their price, such as a little brickwork and connections etc. If we can save anything we will of course do so.

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AGREEMENT made and entered into this 21<sup>st</sup> day of AUGUST.

A. D. 1930, BETWEEN:

CALGARY POWER COMPANY LIMITED, a body corporate with its Head Office at the City of Montreal, in the Province of Quebec, (hereinafter called "the Power Company").

OF THE FIRST PART.

A N D

HIS MAJESTY KING GEORGE THE FIFTH, represented by the Minister of the Interior of Canada (Department of Indian Affairs) and represented herein by J. F. Woodsworth, the acting Principal of the "Indian Residential School" situate on the North East quarter of Section Eleven (11), Township Fifty-four (54), Range Twenty-five (25) West of the fourth Meridian, (hereinafter called "the Customer")

OF THE SECOND PART.

WHEREAS the Power Company is a corporation duly incorporated under the laws of the Dominion of Canada and operates an hydro-electric power system in the Province of Alberta as a licensee of Dominion Water Powers by virtue of licenses granted to it by the Minister of the Interior of Canada pursuant to and subject to the provisions of the Dominion Water Power Act, being Chapter 210 of the Revised Statutes of Canada, 1927, and (or) The Dominion Lands Act and the Dominion Water Power Regulations passed by the Governor-General in Council under the authority of the said Acts;

AND WHEREAS the Power Company proposes to extend its

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electrical transmission system so as to be in a position to supply the Customer with electrical power and energy as hereinafter provided.

AND WHEREAS the Customer is willing to purchase from the Power Company all the Customer's entire requirements of electrical power and energy for use in said Indian Residential School and all buildings connected, used or operated for the purposes of said School; said School and said buildings being hereinafter referred to as "said School premises";

NOW THEREFORE THIS AGREEMENT WITNESSETH that the parties hereto covenant, promise and agree the one with the other as follows,-

1. COMMENCEMENT OF SUPPLY

The Power Company shall commence the supply of electrical energy and power hereunder to the Customer on or before the thirty-first day of October, A.D.1920.

2. TERM OF CONTRACT.

This Contract shall remain in full force and effect for a period of five (5) years from the date of commencement of supply hereunder. The Customer shall from the date at which supply hereunder can be commenced purchase from the Power Company the Customer's entire requirements of electrical energy and power in said school premises during the life of this agreement. The Power Company shall, from the date at which it commences supply hereunder, sell and deliver to the Customer all

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electrical energy and power required by it from time to time for use in said school premises, during the life of this Contract.

3. VOLTAGE AND FREQUENCY.

The electrical energy and power to be supplied hereunder shall be furnished in the following manner,-

- (a) For power purposes in the form of three phase alternating current, at a normal pressure of two hundred and twenty (220) volts; and
- (b) For lighting and domestic purposes single phase three-wire service at a normal pressure of approximately 110 - 220 volts;

Provided always that said electrical energy and power to be supplied as aforesaid shall have a normal frequency of sixty (60) cycles per second, with a variation in the aforesaid respective voltages of generally not more than six (6) per cent above or below normal, and a variation in frequency of generally not more than one (1) per cent above or below normal.

4. SERVICE.

The Power Company shall endeavour to maintain normal voltage and frequency and render service equal to that usually furnished by modern hydro-electric systems where conditions are similar, and the Customer shall use the electrical energy and power to be supplied hereunder only for the Customer's aforesaid purposes, and all apparatus and equipment shall be installed and maintained and said electrical energy and power shall be used by the Customer in such a manner as not to cause sudden fluctuations

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in the demand for the said energy and power such as would cause disturbance to the system of the Power Company.

5. CONTINUITY OF SERVICE.

The Power Company shall cause to be taken all usual precautions to guard against interruptions or diminutions in the supply of electrical energy and power to the Customer, and shall cause to be terminated such interruptions and diminutions with all possible despatch. If interruptions or diminutions are necessary or unavoidable for repair, overhauling or inspection of equipment or for improving or adding to its equipment the Power Company shall give the Customer reasonable notice of the same, if possible, and shall cause such interruptions or diminutions to be made at such time as to cause the minimum inconvenience and loss to the Customer.

6. RATES OR PRICES.

The maximum rates or prices which the Power Company shall charge the Customer for electrical energy and power during the term of this Agreement, shall be in accordance with the

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following Schedule,-

COMMERCIAL RATES.

Available for all purposes where Power Rate does not apply.

Service charge of \$1.20 per month for the first 500 watts of installed capacity and 40¢ per month for each additional 250 watts together with an energy charge on the following basis:-

First 100 hours' use of Installed Capacity .10¢ per K.W.H.  
Next 100 hours' use of Installed capacity . 5¢ per K.W.H.  
Over 200 hours' use of Installed capacity . 3 1/2¢ per K.W.H.

The Minimum monthly charge shall be no less than the Commercial Service charge during one month.

Prompt payment discount - 10 per cent on the even Dollars
