Indian Residential School

Referring to your letter of August 5th with the letter written to your department dated April 27th was enclosed by-law No. 295 of the Town of Birtle providing for the opening of a roadway taking the northerly 30 feet of S.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ of 8-17-26 in the Municipality of Birtle and dedicating it as a public roadway. There was also enclosed a consent in triplicate and transfer of the said land to be completed by the proper officers and returned. This transfer and consent is required under the Municipal Act for the opening of roads in Manitoba by the Municipal Commissioner for Manitoba.

The opening of this roadway is a condition precedent to the withdrawal by Tom Johnston of their objections to the passing of by-law No. 282 and 288. You have also a copy of the undertaking of Thomas Johnston withdrawing objections to By-laws No. 282 and 288 upon establishing northerly 30 feet of S.W. 8-17-26 for road purposes under by-law 295.

Kindly therefore forward the consent and transfer and copy of the order-in-council when this matter may be proceeded with and finally concluded.
