MEMORANDUM TO MR. WEBB:

Re: Kamloops Indian School -
Alterations to Irrigation Intake

In connection with the above, the improvements suggested in my report of December 7, 1943 and authorized in Mr. Mills' letter of January 21, 1943 on behalf of the Indian Affairs Branch were undertaken and completed March 31, 1943.

The work consisted of lowering the pump well and intake pipe on the South Thompson River used for irrigation purposes on the school property. It had been found that during low water periods in the fall and occasionally in spring, water was not available for irrigation at the pump intake. The school authorities maintained that the irrigation season was unduly curtailed by lack of water for a part of the growing season and resulted in poor yield and sometimes loss of crop.

The old pipeline consisting of two 18-inch vitrified tile pipes was uncovered and relaid two feet deeper as a single pipe 104 feet long with an extension of 36 feet of 16-inch creosoted wood stave pipe at the river end. A concrete base and head wall was constructed to support the intake end of the pipe and a screen was installed to prevent drift from entering the pipe.

A sheet pile coffer dam installed to facilitate excavation in the river bed was left in place and was backfilled with rock, covering the pipe to a depth of about two feet and for a distance of about 50 feet from the river end towards the well, a riprap of rock was provided outside

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the coffer dam.

The concrete well curbing was lowered about two feet six inches and a concrete bottom installed in the well. The work of lowering the curbing proved to be very hazardous owing to the poor quality of the concrete. This fractured badly and broke off at the bottom during the process of lowering and had to be replaced. Three feet in height was added to the top of the well to compensate for the lowering of the curbing and three feet of ten-inch wrought steel pipe was added to the length of the suction pipe. Pumping had to be maintained throughout the operation owing to excessive seepage.

The cost of the work was \$839.24 of which \$186.46 was expended for material and \$652.78 for labour and supervision.

No difficulty should be encountered in future in securing an adequate irrigation supply. Some difficulty may however, be experienced with ice during very cold winters. The old intake pipeline was just above the ice elevation under normal conditions. It is quite possible that with an extremely low river level some damage may be caused at the outer end of the pipeline.



General;

The Kamloops Indian School was visited frequently, and on one visit the general fire alarm was tested, and the building emptied in an orderly manner, in two minutes. The test was made after lunch, when the smallest pupils were having a rest period in the upper floor dormitories, and had to use the fire escapes. When the alarm sounded, many of the girls were employed canning fruit, and when they formed up in the yard for roll-call check-up, most of them were clutching jars of fruit which they had apparently thought worth "rescuing".

Arrangements are being made to have the Chief of the Kamloops City fire brigade visit the school to assist in forming the boys and staff into an emergency brigade, and to advise re procedure, etc.


