


We are in receipt of your letter of November 25th enclosing letter of the same date from Rt. Rev. J.P. Mackey, Principal of the above school, with reference to the financial situation.

Careful consideration has been given to the contents of both letters.

While we appreciate careful management, at the same time we feel that funds accumulated are intended to be used at a subsequent date for expenditures that would improve conditions for the pupils and that are not ordinarily provided by the Department.

During the war years when our appropriations were reduced, it was necessary to expect schools which had a surplus from previous years to use the funds for expenditures that possibly would have been supplied by the Department in ordinary years.

Mr. Phelan expects to be in Shubenacadie next week and will be prepared to discuss the whole situation further with Msgr. Mackey and yourself. He will bring the accounts with him.



During the recent visit of Dr. H. L. KEENLEYSIDE, Deputy Minister of Mines & Resources, the situation at the captionally noted School was brought to his attention by the Principal, Rt. Rev. J. P. Mackey and myself.

In our informal discussion the whole financial situation was brought to light, and in particular the matter of repairs to the building that was effected by using the School money. Dr. KEENLEYSIDE requested that a detailed account be submitted to you and a copy of the letter forwarded to him, in order that his memory be refreshed. This is being done and I would strongly recommend that if at all possible the School be re-imbursed for the major repairs and replacements which were made by using School funds.





MEMORANDUM

Re: Shubenacadie Indian Residential School.

An inspection was recently carried out at the above school in connection with the completion of two contracts. Our inspecting officer furnishes comment on both contracts as follows:-

(a) Domestic Hot and Cold Water Revisions -

Our officer met Mr. W.J. Christie, Plumbing and Heating Contractor, who has completed revisions and additions to the Domestic hot and Cold Water System at the school, and the work was carefully examined.

The installation has been carried out in a most satisfactory and workmanlike manner, and in accordance with the plans and specifications prepared by this Division; and to the satisfaction of the school authorities and Indian Superintendent H.C. Rice.

Under the circumstances, we have accepted the work, and are returning the security deposit to the Contractor.

(b) Waterproofing Contract -


While our officer was in Shubenacadie, he inspected the waterproofing work carried out by Messrs. Creaghan and Archibald. Their Halifax representative Mr. Peitkin, under whose supervision this work was executed, reviewed all phases of the work with our officer, and explained, in detail, how the various operations included in the contract, were carried out.

The caulking around the window and door frames was carefully examined, and appeared to have been well done. The finish over the entire wall surface was put on under pressure, and it is evident that no pains were spared to make a thoroughly good job.

The colour is a medium grey, and some areas are slightly darker than the main surface. It was explained that this was due to varying weather conditions at the time the finish was being applied. The opinion was expressed, by Mr. Peitkin, that the weathering effect will ultimately result in a solid colour throughout. While the general appearance of the building is quite different from its original colour, it is not unpleasant.

Several severe rainstorms have occurred since this was completed, and there has been no evidence of any filtration of water through the walls. The Principal and Indian Superintendent H.C. Rice, both, expressed complete satisfaction. Under the circumstances, the work has been accepted and we are releasing the Contractor's security deposit.



As you are no doubt aware, the firm of Creighton and Archibald, 1440 St. Catherine Street, West Montreal, P. Q., has recently completed a water proofing job on the captionally noted school.

During the last thirty-six hours we have had a very heavy rain accompanied with gales of wind force and as a result we find that the weather proofing job as performed by this Company is definitely not satisfactory. Along the whole western front of the building, numerous leaks appeared and it is felt that the remainder of the building is possibly in the same condition. The following telegram was dispatched to the firm in question:-

" Indian Residential School, Shubenacadie, N. S. which your firm has recently completed water proofing leaking very badly and your immediate attention is requested."

Although we have not got the contract entered into with this Company, it is felt that this is a guaranteed job for a period of five to ten years.







Reference to the weather proofing job recently completed at the captionally noted school and further to my letter of recent date respecting same.

On Sunday last, a Representative of the firm of Creighton & Archibald visited the Indian Residential School and went over the whole building. At the time, it was impossible for him to know exactly where the leaks were originating but requested that during the next severe rain storm, he be contacted at his Halifax headquarters at which time he will proceed to Shubenacadie in an effort to trace the leaks.

It should be pointed out that at the time the leaks appeared in this building, we were experiencing one of the worst rain storms in recent years, and it is quite possible that these leaks might not show up again for some time. However, the work is definitely defective to some degree and as it is a guaranteed job for five years we will see that the situation is rectified.

Due to weather conditions during the next few months, it will be impossible to carry on any work of this nature until Spring. However, should we have a severe enough rain to call this Representative, he will mark the leaks in order that his Company can proceed with the necessary alterations in the Spring.
