"Farm-work was in good shape and stock in fine condition. Mr. Scott, the new Farm Instructor is doing good work in his instructions to the boys in feeding and care of stock. This school needs a new pig-pen. Estimates for 1927-28 did not include this item and the Principal has been compelled to discontinue the raising of pigs until some sort of pen is supplied. Could not the Department allow sufficient money to build some pens? This should not cost \$500.00."



Sir:

I have your letter of the 18th instant, No. 104-2-5, informing me that Agent Gooderham recommends that a hog pen be erected at the Crowfoot Indian Residential School, and in reply would say that I have taken this matter up with Inspector Christianson, who has visited this school quite frequently, in fact once or twice a year, and he is of the opinion that there is no urgent necessity for a hog pen. This is borne out by the fact that it would have been inserted in the agency estimates had it been needed very badly. I will not give my recommendation until I have the Inspector look into this and if it is found necessary, an amount can be placed in next year's estimates.

If the Department have any money to spare under the School Vote, I would once again strongly urge that a residence be built for the Farming Instructor at the Gordon's Indian Residential School. This school is in far more need of additional outbuildings than any other residential school that I know of. The stables are small and inadequate to house a sufficient number of cows and the horse stable is very small. The Farming Instructor was brought from the east on the understanding that he would be given a residence. The man has arrived and he is a good man, and now we will be called upon to tell him that he will not be able to bring his wife to live with him this winter. A married instructor is necessary at this place, and I do hope that the Department will scrape up \$2500.00 to meet this request as this school is deserving of some consideration.

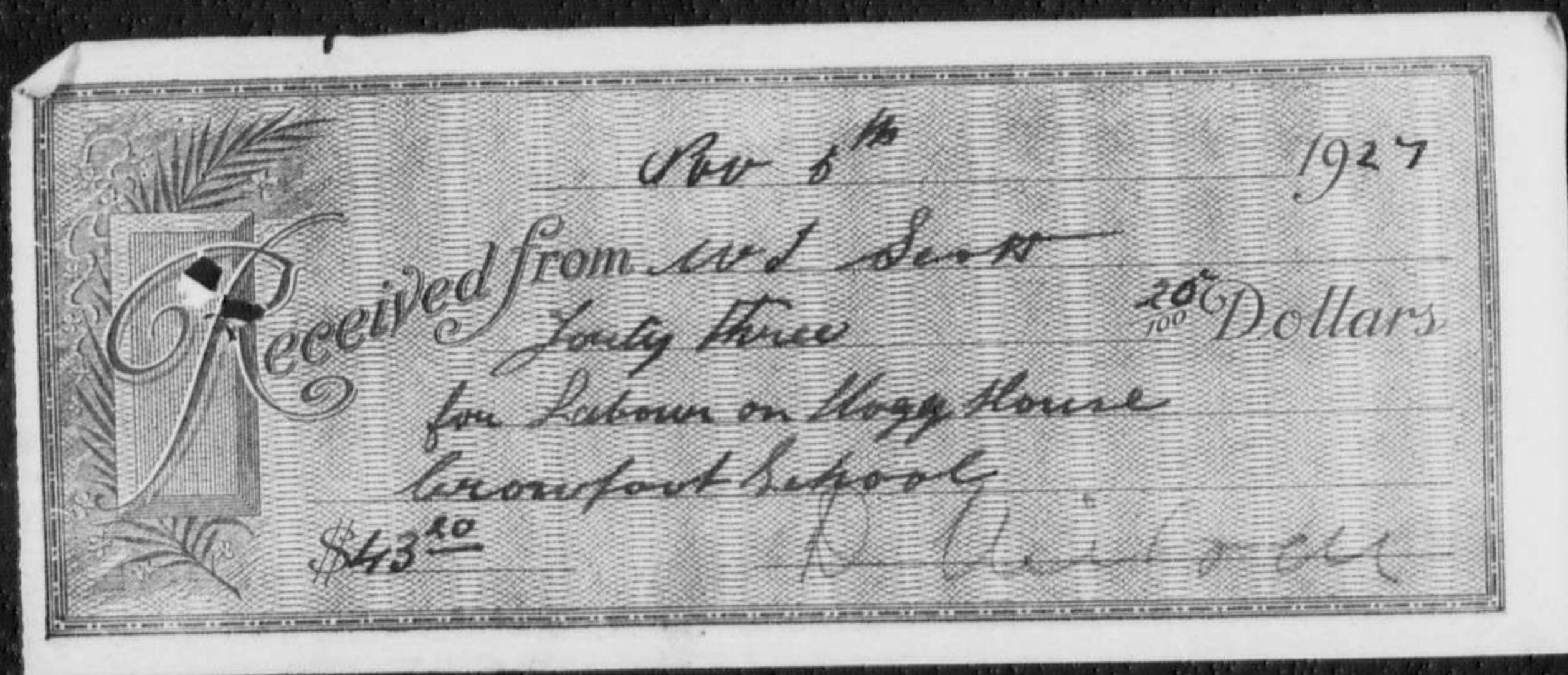
