I enclose for your information a letter recently received from Archdeacon Cook with reference to the Alert Bay Residential School. It is noted from this communication that the M.S.C.C. is prepared to be responsible for the labour required for painting and repairs, provided the annual vacation period be extended for three months.

We feel that any such extension of the holiday period would be inadvisable for many reasons and consequently we would like you to give us an estimate of what labour would cost to do the work that is absolutely essential. Previous to submitting this estimate you might communicate with the Reverend principal and ascertain what assistance in the form of labour the school staff is prepared to give during the months of July and August and if you have this information it would reduce the amount that the Department would be expected to pay.

You should also forward a requisition for the paint and materials for repairs that you recommend and let us know the approximate cost of these, and if they can be purchased in British Columbia you should submit the names and addresses of the firms from whom the paint and materials can be secured.

Dear Archdeacon Cook:

We have your letter of the 5th instant with reference to the Alert Bay Residential School. It is noted that in connection with the painting and repair work that you consider necessary at the Alert Bay School, you offer to supply labour if the Department supplies the material. We appreciate your co-operation in this regard but it appears that this would be contingent on increasing the holiday leave from two months to three months.

For many reasons we feel that it is inadvisable to increase the holidays at any one school unless the situation is more serious than at Alert Bay.

We are writing to Indian Commissioner Arneil requesting him to let us have an estimate of the cost of the labour in carrying out the repairs and painting during the months of July and August. We are instructing him to communicate with the Reverend Principal of the Alert Bay school with a view to ascertaining how much labour can be supplied by the school staff and intimating to him that we will be prepared to pay the cost of the labour over and above what is supplied free by the staff. We are also requesting him to submit a requisition for the paint and materials required.

It was noted by district School Inspector Davey during his visit to the Alert Bay Residential School that there were insufficient beds and mattresses to accommodate the enrolled pupilage and that many of the springs and mattresses in use were in very poor shape. Mr. Acting Indian Agent Letcher was requested to consult with the Principal and advise what items were required to bring this equipment up to standard. The Acting Agent's letter of February 5th and enclosure in this connection is attached hereto and I would recommend that the departmental purchasing be requested to secure 24 single beds complete with springs and mattresses and 24 additional mattresses. If the Department so desires prices can be secured in Vancouver but it is anticipated that the expenditure would exceed \$500.00, the maximum amount which the Commissioner has authority to cover by purchase order.

In reference to School Inspector Davey's letter, file 6-11-1, dated January 24th, I wish to advise that the following beds and mattresses are urgently required by the Residential School:

24 only single, cot style beds with springs
48 " Mattresses, cot size

In support of this requisition we are enclosing herewith a letter received from the Principal which is self explanatory.

It is suggested that War Assets Corporation be contacted with a view to obtaining the requirements from their surplus stores, if such items are available. Hospital cots would be the ideal solution, as these are much stronger and will stand the abuse of the male pupils. It is recommended that the equipment be supplied as soon as possible.



I am forwarding Mr. Acting Indian Agent Letcher's letter of January 22nd and enclosure referred to therein, together with a memorandum dated January 28th from District School Inspector Davey in connection with the proposed supply of masonite for covering the tables in the dining room at the Alert Bay Indian Residential School.

The condition of the tables is such that some covering is necessary and in view of conditions in general at the school as revealed by a recent investigation by the School Inspector it is considered that everything possible should be done to improve the standard at this school.

Although the Principal requests white masonite, the material he has in mind is not actually masonite but a plastic composition which costs 75¢ a foot compared to 18¢ a foot for black masonite which would be equally suitable. The cost of black masonite and aluminum counter edge moulding is approximately \$175.00 and I would recommend that the Department endeavour to make funds available for the purchase of this material.
