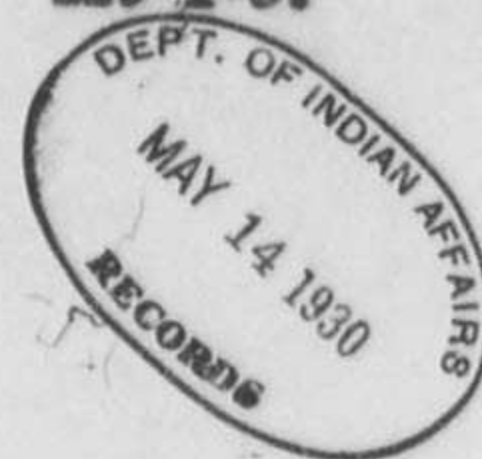

Very Reverend Sir:

I wish to refer to conversation with Mr. Ferrier when you were in Ottawa a few days ago. It was understood that approximately \$4,000 could be expended on improvements at the Kenora Indian Residential School. It had been suggested that land be cleared, drained and fenced, that a hogpen be erected, the wharf repaired and some interior decorating undertaken. I now write to inform you that it has been found necessary to expend nearly \$3,000 on very urgent repairs to the water supply and sewage disposal systems. Will you please correspond with the Rev. Principal and let me have a recommendation concerning how the \$1,000 which remains for this school can best be expended.

Sir:-

I have received complaints from our neighbour north of the School land, Mr. W.G. Cameron, that the actual fence is, at some places, over his property; Mr. Cameron requires that said fence be put in proper place.

I beg to say that this fence has been put up by one of my predecessors, and was likely done to the best of their knowledge, for the survey posts are not to be found, being rotten or run over, and that, for the benefit of our neighbours and of our own, I am anxious to have this error redressed. But, as we are not able to locate the survey posts, I beg to ask the Department to send a surveyor to trace them up and put permanent posts where necessary.

Sir,-

The Department desires to have the land limits of the Kenora school properties re-established and all corners marked with an iron post. The properties to be surveyed consist of two parcels,- Firstly: the East $\frac{1}{2}$ of the West part of Location I.8, situate in the Township of Jaffray, which parcel is listed in the Land Registry Office, District of Kenora, as parcel No.8721, a copy of the plan of which is attached to Patent No.6161, in the Land Titles Office, Kenora. Secondly: that part of the Kenora Indian reserve No.38B, containing 118.8 acres, which parcel is registered in the Land Titles Office at Kenora under number 8666 and subsequently transferred to the Crown by Transfer No.18649.

For this work you will be paid at the rate of \$15.00 per day and all reasonable expenses in connection with the survey. It is desired that you obtain as much of the labour assistance as possible through the school authorities. Your returns will consist of a plan on tracing linen showing the work performed and the location and nature of the boundary monuments. This should be accompanied by your account, with vouchers attached, all in duplicate. This survey is primarily to be undertaken for the purpose of immediately establishing the line which it is desired to fence and it is hoped you will be able to undertake the survey at once.

Memorandum

Schools Branch, -

As arranged in conversation with Mr. Sutherland, herewith find instructions for Mr. McMeekin to perform the survey necessary. Sir:

I have your letter of the 7th instant, enclosing a communication from the Principal of the Kenora Indian Residential School, relative to the fencing required and requesting that the services of a surveyor be engaged to trace the boundaries of the school property and put in permanent posts where necessary. The estimate, stating the quantity of fencing material and the approximate cost of same, together with the labour required in erecting the fence, as mentioned by you, has also been noted.

Regarding the surveying of the school property, I enclose herewith a communication, addressed to Albert McMeekin, O. L. S., Kenora, authorizing him to carry out the survey of the property, as mentioned therein and have all corners marked with an iron post. You should consult Mr. McMeekin and ascertain if he can perform the survey at an early date. If so, you should hand him the enclosed letter of instructions. After the boundaries of the property, where the fencing is required, are determined by the surveyor, the Department will approve of the fencing necessary and you may arrange for the purchase of the fencing material, gates, etc. The school authorities should assist the surveyor in his work as far as possible and also in the labour of erecting the fence. It is noted you estimate the cost of the material and the labour to be \$671.65. The Department considers that this figure is high and hopes that a considerable saving in this amount can be effected by you in the purchase of the materials and in the labour.

After the fence has been erected, you should forward accounts, in duplicate, properly certified, covering the cost of all materials and for the labour employed. You should also have the surveyor prepare his account, in duplicate, covering the cost of the survey. He will be allowed payment at the rate mentioned in the letter to him. Please give the above matter your early attention.

I have completed a resurvey of
the two plots of land and
enclose bill of costs.

Due to the timber being cut
off the south location, the
undergrowth was dense
and required a lot of
cutting. I reblazed the lines
fully so that they can easily
follow them. If they took
time to thoroughly clear out
the lines, then they would
never have any difficulty
in finding them.

I placed new wooden posts
and also iron posts 1" x 1" x 36"
so that the corners are
easily discovered.

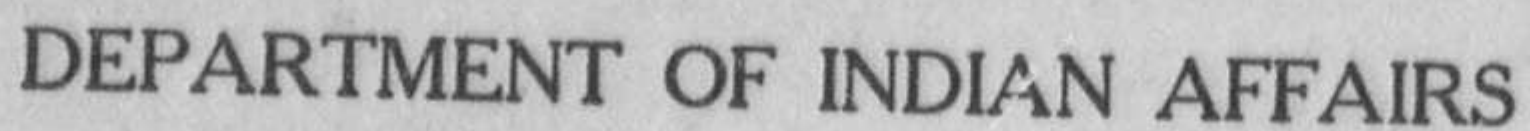

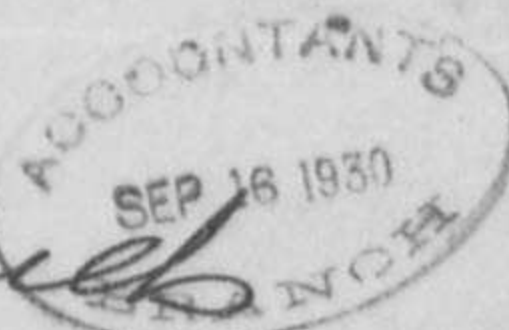
