Dear Sir

This letter explains to you more fully the subject of my wire to you of the 29<sup>th</sup> inst. I was informed by Mr Dill of Dill & Adkinson Contractors, that Enamelled Brick as specified for Kitchen walls can be obtained only from Toronto, and it will take two months or more to obtain delivery to Tytton.

As these Brick form part of the main wall of building, it will mean delaying the progress of the work for that length of time. As an alternative Mr Dill asks that Enamel Wall Tile be used instead, stocks of which are available in Vancouver B.C. As I could not concede to anything of that kind & in order to help Mr Dill and the expedition of the work I referred the matter to you by wire.

Mr Dill also informs me that he has not included Enamel Brick or Wall Tile (in his tender) for walls of Scullery, as no mention of it is made in your Specifications & is at a loss to know what finish the

scullery walls are to have - for it is mentioned that no plaster is necessary in Scullery (nor wood trim) (as in Kitchen & Assembly room) yet it cannot be of Brick as three sides of room has stud partitions. Kindly advise me whether it shall be of Plaster or Enamel Wall Tile.

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

Construction of new school is steadily progressing - as far as deliveries of materials with permit of work of pouring concrete for foundation walls of rear wing - assembly hall etc is going ahead.

First carload of Brick arrived from Salmon Arm. but as these brick were not sufficiently hard burnt, and had rough wrecut ends - I forbade their use on any exterior work.

Carload of Brick arrived from a V I maker, These Brick are in every way satisfactory both as to quality & appearance, and will be used throughout the building

Work on roughing in of underground work of Plumbing has commenced. Soil piping etc and large sections of which has been thoroughly tested (by water test) by the writer.

Shipments of Hollow Tile and Window Frames are due to arrive & as soon as they do, work will commence on Brickwork.

We have the contract for the building of St. George's Indian School near Lytton, B.C. for which we gave you a marked cheque for Thirteen thousand nine hundred dollars. (\$13,900.00).

In the specifications for the above building in the portion "Instructions to Bidders", it states that war bonds of the Dominion or Canadian National Railway bonds will be accepted as security. The bonds must be deposited in a chartered bank, subject to the order of the Deputy Superintendent-General and a certificate should be given by the Manager of the bank saying that the bonds have been deposited with him. With this information and finding that our money would lie for a considerable time with the department and no interest be paid thereon, we thought it would be good business to secure the bonds and have our money released.

The securing of the bonds we have accomplished and placed them with the Canadian Bank of Commerce in Vancouver with the request that they notify you of same and get payment for our cheque. We thought, according to the above clauses of the specification that we were quite right. We are informed by the bank, however, that you require the bonds in Ottawa and have, therefore, instructed the bank to send them to you at once. If you would please have our deposit money released to the bank, immediately on receipt of the bonds, you will confer on us a great favor as at the present time we are without both our money and the bonds.





I beg to acknowledge receipt of your telegram of the 15th instant in reply to mine of the 14th regarding connections with the main drain at the Lytton School. Your telegram read as hereunder:-

Ottawa, Ont. Sept. 14.

"W.E. Ditchburn.  
"Indian Commissioner,

- "Separate drain pipe to be installed for
- "sewage from laundry and kitchen of Lytton

- "under direction of Dominion Water Power
- "Branch. J.D. McLean."

In connection with this matter, I beg to say that while at Kamloops last week, Engineer Tredcroft, of the Dominion Water Power Branch, informed me as to the instructions set forth in the specifications which were not in accord with his original plan of drainage for the School. Engineer Tredcroft could understand why you did not want the water from the laundry and kitchen to pass through the main drain in the School building underneath the cement flooring, but considered that it could be carried to the outside of the building and attached to the sewer to be passed through the septic tank with the sewage from the toilets, etc. To have a separate sewer from the laundry and kitchen to be carried down a distance of about six hundred feet and connected with inspection chamber on the outlet pipe from the septic tank would entail a further expenditure of approximately \$500.00 for which authority for this further expenditure must be given, if it is to be carried out as per your telegram. I am attaching hereto a pencil sketch made by Engineer Tredcroft showing where it is proposed to put in the separate drain from the kitchen and laundry and conduct the same to the outlet chamber from the septic tank. It also shows where the Engineer had proposed for this drainage to enter the main sewer outside the building above the septic tank. Mr. Tredcroft is of the opinion that the passage of the drainage from the kitchen and laundry through the sewer and out through the septic tank would not in any way effect the septic action; in

fact he considered it would be beneficial as it was most desirable to have some other drainage go through this system other than that from the toilets.

I would strongly recommend that you should wire to Engineer Tredcroft, who is now at Lytton, authority for this additional expenditure, which must necessarily be contracted.
