In case that you would not feel like paying the difference between the cars might I remind you that I have been using my own car for the past two years in the interests of the School and the Dept. of Indian Affairs. In that time I have gone thirteen thousand miles, and the actual charge to the Dept. for the car is less than one hundred and twenty dollars. If I had been allowed the usual ten or twelve cents a mile you can easily see the difference. The fact is that I have been paying the charges for the car and not asking the Dept. to pay the most of them.

If I may have the new car I would like to know soon as I have not registered the Chev. for this year. The Buick model 47 sells here for \$ 1940.00

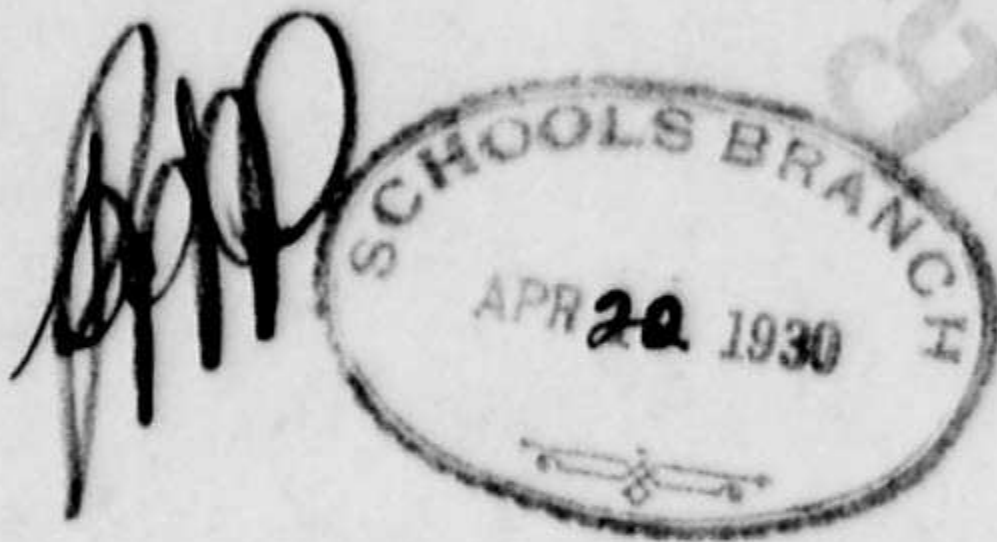

In reply to your letter of the 12th. inst.
In May 1928 I had spent \$ 950.00 for a Chev. car
and used that car for business of your Department
for the past two years. During that time I had gone
13000 miles, and the Dept. has been charged less than
\$ 120.00, for gas, oil, repairs etc. including license.
Now you expect me to put at least the trading-in price
into another car of about equal value, which when bought
will be considered as the property of the Department of
Indian Affairs. I understood only last fall from a
member of the Dept. that I should have been given a car
at the beginning of my work here.

All I have to say is that I don't think your pro-
position is a fair one, and I am not going to put up about
half the price of a car, after having bought one outright
and used it for two years in the interest of the Dept. of
Indian Affairs.


