Sir:

I have your 262/29 of the 26th ultimo, with reference to reroofing the Alberni Indian Residential School. The Department wishes you to purchase the highest grade cedar shingles from the Alberni Pacific Lumber Co., of Port Alberni. I trust that these can be secured at \$4. per thousand. You should also arrange to have them hauled to the school, at an estimated cost of \$36. You may also purchase, to the best advantage, the galvanized nails, flashing and gutter material, as well as the material for scaffolding, etc., as mentioned in your Estimate No. 1, which you enclosed. You may engage Mr. L. A. Pineo, of Alberni, to lay the shingles by contract. You should offer him \$2.50 per thousand. You may also arrange to have the shingles dipped in linseed oil at \$2 per thousand. Mr. Pineo should be offered this work as well.

The Department relies on you to arrange for this work at your earliest convenience and trusts that you will be able to keep the cost within your estimate of \$1182.80.

I have the honour to acknowledge receipt of the Department's letter of 15th instant re the above matter and beg to advise the Department that this work was recommended last year, since which time minor repairs has had to be made, Estimates were submitted in letter No. 123/28, dated May 29th, 1928.

Since receiving the Department's letter of 15th instant I have made exhaustive enquiries regarding the cost of various kinds of roofing and am submitting the estimated cost of each separately.

I respectfully beg to state that in my opinion the most suitable material for the purpose in question is the Johns Manville Asbestos Shingle, this material is more expensive but when its wearing qualities, weatherproofing and appearance as well as its fire resisting abilities are considered I am of the opinion that the extra cost is compensated for.


