




The Department agrees that 15 milch cows, 4 or 5 heifers and one bull are required.

Extract from Mr. C. A. Archibald's letter of December 6th
addressed to Mr. R. S. Hamer

"I was out through the Shubenacadie district yesterday looking over some of the herds. Father MacKey advised me that the member for Hants County was very anxious to have the purchasing done in Hants County. I assured him that it would be very difficult for them to secure in any one county a herd of cattle that would be representative or good enough for an institution and as he had been in company with a buyer the week previous who had been paying as high as \$125.00 for pretty ordinary grades, he agreed with me.

We discussed the situation pretty thoroughly and while I can see his viewpoint of submitting prices to the Department at Ottawa and waiting for their acceptance, it is going to make it very difficult to secure the cattle. It will also be considerably more expensive as no one can buy economically in that way. In other words, if we can go into a stable ready to buy and pin a man down to the actual value of the stock he is offering and have the sale slip signed there and then, we know just what we are doing. But as these cattle are to be bought subject to delivery sometime in January, as soon as the stable is complete, unless we tie the breeders up in some way it is almost unreasonable to ask them to hold their cattle should another buyer come in.

I know that you would want us to secure a representative herd, well up to the standard of whatever breed they were, or you would very much rather we did not touch the selection in any way. If you can see the officer in charge of the Indian Department and have this straightened out with a distinct understanding as to the maximum price they are willing to pay, it would help the work greatly. The other questions, such as buying out of accredited herds, date of calving, ages, etc. I took up with Father MacKey and the only thing I would like to have now is a distinct ruling on prices.

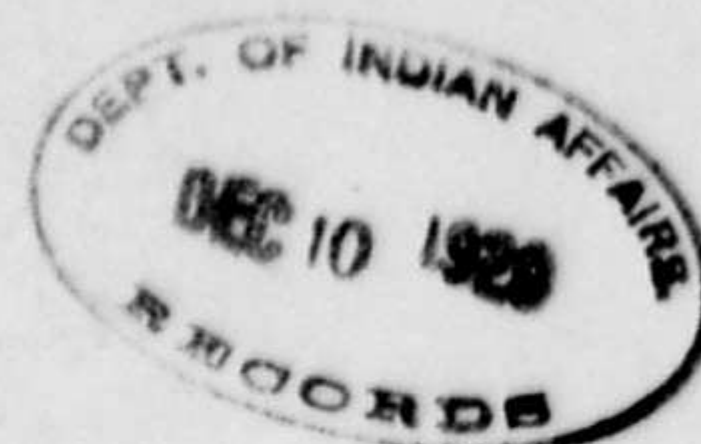
I might say that I assured Father MacKey that it would be a difficult achievement to secure the whole herd in Nova Scotia and we might be forced to go across to Prince Edward Island for a few head."



Re purchase of cattle for school


Referring to my telephone conversation of this morning with Mr. Ferrier, I am now enclosing extract from letter received from Mr. C. A. Archibald, representative of my Division at Truro, Nova Scotia, who has been asked to assist Father MacKey in the purchase of cattle for the Indian School at Shubenacadie.

You will note that Mr. Archibald feels that it will be very difficult to secure satisfactory values if it is necessary to submit prices to Ottawa before closing any transactions and asks whether it would be possible to allow Father MacKey more latitude in this respect.

I infer from correspondence received from Mr. Archibald on this subject that in any discussions which he has had with Father MacKey he has understood that the purchase of only pure bred Ayrshires is contemplated. I understood from Mr. Ferrier that your Department is not particularly interested in the establishment of a breeding herd at Shubenacadie and that the primary consideration is the securing of cattle to supply milk for the institution. In that event, it might be better business to endeavour to secure the best grade cows obtainable than to pay extra money for registered cattle.

I would suggest the desirability of having the decision of your Department on this point made clear to Mr. Archibald through Father MacKey before any purchasing is undertaken.

Reverend Sir:

With further reference to your letter of the 4th and to my reply of the 7th instant, concerning a milch herd for the Shubenacadie Indian Residential School, I have now to inform you that the Department is considering placing the purchase entirely in the hands of Mr. C. A. Archibald, Dominion Live Stock representative, at Truro. I will write to you in a few days, giving final instructions. As you have been informed, the Department believes that 15 milch cows, 4 or 5 heifers and one bull are required.

I note your preference for the Ayrshire breed, and I now write to state that the Department does not consider it necessary to limit the selection to purebred, registered animals only. It is possible that grade cows would be suitable, and you might get more beef from the male animals and old cows that are killed. Of course, only accredited herds or tuberculine tested cows should be considered. I will write in a few days, giving final instructions.

Sir:

With further reference to your letter of the 9th and to my reply of the 10th instant, I have now to request your Branch to select and purchase a milch herd for the Shubenacadie Indian Residential School. Selection is not limited to herds in Hants County, if better satisfaction can be secured elsewhere; but I should be grateful if you would instruct Mr. Archibald to give the preference to dealers in the federal constituency in which the school is located.

There is required 15 milch cows, 5 heifers and one bull. The Rev. Principal prefers the Ayrshire breed, but I do not wish to dictate in this connection, as the matter will be left entirely with your Branch. The Department does not consider it necessary to limit the selection to pure-bred or registered animals only. It is possible that grade cows would be suitable and, of course, less expensive. I know you will consider only accredited herds or tuberculin tested animals.

This Department will be very grateful if you will give the necessary instructions to Mr. Archibald at your earliest convenience. If your office will forward the accounts, in duplicate, certified by Mr. Archibald, they will be paid. The question of price will be left entirely with you. *Copy of official letter to the Principal enclosed.*

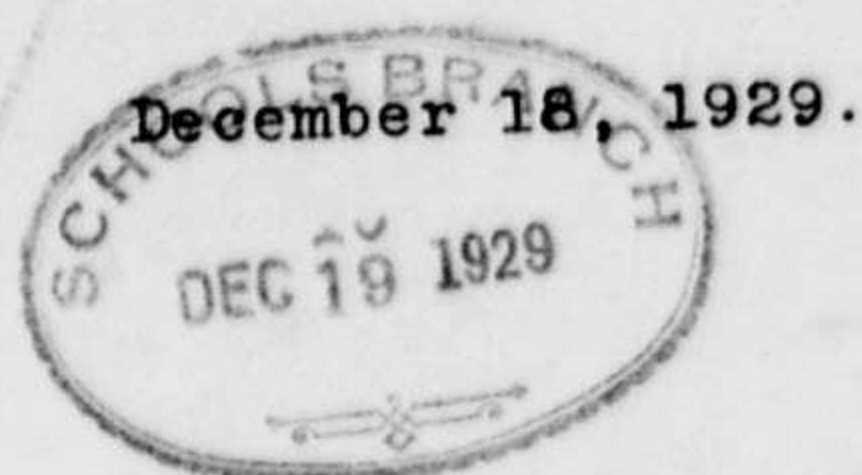

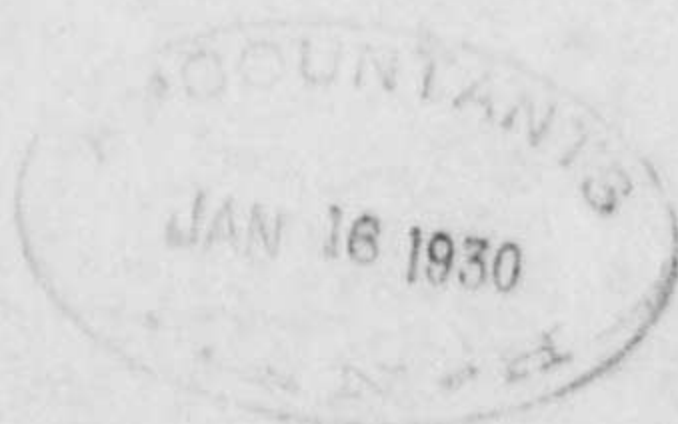

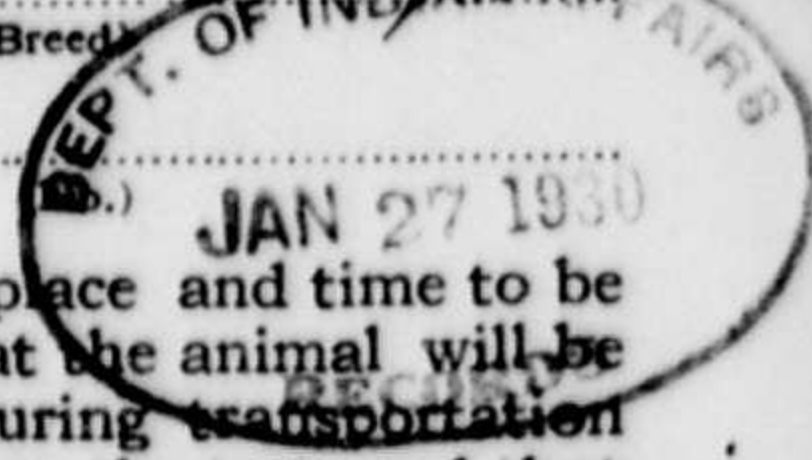
