




The Department has received, through the office of His Honour Judge Dowler, Judge of the District of Kenora, the report of the Grand Jury on their inspection of the Cecilia Jeffrey Indian Residential School. They report as follows:-

"We find this building to be well managed and attendance above the average. The building itself, however, is badly in need of painting, both inside and out, and is deteriorating on this account. The sashes are shrunken and windows need weather-stripping and caulking. If this were done a huge saving could be effected in fuel. We also note that sewerage from seepage field is rising to surface and running into lake, endangering the purity of the water supply. If this condition is not remedied an epidemic might result. We would, therefore, recommend that additional tile piping be added to existing distribution field to obviate this nuisance by increasing the area of seepage field."

There is an amount of \$300 in our Appropriation for the current fiscal year for the carrying out of general repairs to this school. I would request, therefore, that you take up the matter with the Principal and inform the Department definitely as to the amount of repairs, etc., that are urgently required, at a cost not exceeding the above mentioned amount.

There will be no funds for the exterior painting of the building. However, the Principal and yourself should decide what work is recommended to be carried out in the way of general repairs, including the cost of material and any outside labour that may be required.







The Department was forwarded a copy of the Grand Jury's report by His Honour Judge Dewler, and a copy was directed to Mr. Frank Edwards, Indian Agent, Kenora, Ont., with the request that he take up the matters referred to with the Principal. Mr. Edwards was asked to inform the Department definitely concerning the amount of repairs required to the building and the work needed to place the sewage disposal system in a satisfactory condition.

When the Department receives particulars, consideration will be given to authorizing the work, as far as funds will permit.

Dear Sir:

Replying to your letter 129-3-5 of 15th. ultimo re appropriation of \$300:00 for general repairs to the Cecilia Jeffrey Residential School.

On receipt of your letter we wrote the Principal, but we have only just received his reply, which we inclose.

On our inspection of the school yesterday he informed us that representatives of the Ontario Department of Health had visited the school two weeks ago and informed him that the sewage disposal bed system should be renovated as it was not functioning properly. They promised to write us, but we have not heard from them as yet, so we have asked the Principal for a letter, explaining the trouble.

He is putting in an appropriation of \$500:00 in the estimates for this work, but it is difficult to give an exact figure.

We would recommend that screens for all doors be provided, and the balance be used for the purchase of paint for the interior. *part of the labour* *the school should supply*

We will forward the communication in regard to the sewage disposal bed as soon as received.


Sir:

I have your letter of the 17th instant, enclosing a communication which you received from the Principal of the Cecilia Jeffrey Indian Residential School, regarding the items requiring attention.


In this connection I have to say that, as you have been informed, there is only the sum of \$300 available in our Appropriation for repairs, etc., at this school during the current fiscal year. The Department will approve of your recommendation, that screens be provided for all doors and that the balance be used to purchase paint for the interior of the school building. You may therefore arrange to provide the screens and also for the purchase, from a firm on the approved list, of a quantity of paint. In carrying out the painting, it should be definitely understood that the school authorities will supply the greater part of the labour. The sum of \$300 should not be exceeded in the cost of the screens, paint and any outside labour required. Please obtain itemized accounts, in triplicate, covering the cost, which you should attach to proper voucher forms, certify in the usual manner and forward for payment.

With reference to the work required in renovating the sewage disposal system, the exterior painting of the school building and the erection of a granary, you should include these items in your estimates for the next fiscal year. Full particulars should be given, as well as the approximate cost. It will not be possible to undertake any large expense this year in improving the sewage disposal bed and it is hoped that this work can stand over until next spring.
