I have your 312-11A of the 24th instant, concerning land for the Gordon's Indian Residential School. I note you recommend that the East half of Section 10 and all of Section 11, T. 27, R. 17, W. 2nd, be set aside. I am at a loss to know whether this is all the land that is required for this school or whether this is for pasture purposes only. The Department has no record as to what land is required for this school. This was placed in your hands in 1921 and evidently no report has been forwarded. I should be grateful if you would let me have a statement as to the exact site of the building and a recommendation as to what sections be set aside for the use of the school.







The other matter I wished to put before you is the question of land. As you know, we have a half section, on part of which stands the old school. There are only 60 acres broken on this half and, although we are clearing the land round the present school, hoping to ultimately join it up to the south land, it is a very slow process. Last year we pulled 850 stumps on eight acres and then ploughed it. There is some open land just north of school and I would be very grateful if you would allow us to work it as we really cannot grow sufficient feed on the small holding we have. Mr. Moore, Indian Agent at Punnichy, knows all the circumstances and knows also that I am trying to do all in my power to make the best of what I have, but I do require some cleared land.




Sir:




Approximately 1/2 mile

Sir,

Reference your No. 312-11A of the 30th ultimo, I beg to report that I have now looked over the land referred to by the Principal of the Gordon's School and which he is anxious to secure for the school, and find that it is immediately North of the land on which the school is situated. There are approximately 75 or 80 acres clear and possibly a further 20 acres of small scrub that could be easily cleared. Of the clear land 50 acres have been cultivated in the past, but have now gone back as nothing has been done on it for 8 or 9 years. This land is claimed by the Pratt family, but they have more land in another part of the reserve which will keep them busy for a long time to come. I enclose sketch as requested.


