The use of these tables is in accordance with present educational practice in the primary grades and I recommend that these be provided. This will free a number of small size desks which may be used either in the Alberni Day School or in other schools for which we have been unable to secure the usual classroom desks.

Your letter dated May 26th last, which you wrote to the Department has been forwarded to this Division for reply and you are accordingly advised as follows:-

Following receipt of your letter dated August 29, 1947, wherein you point out that W.O. Brown, of Port Alberni, British Columbia, the General Contractor on the job, had made no payment to you on your account for millwork, our Superintendent on the work was instructed to investigate the contractor's standing with all sub-contractors and supply firms. It was established that while the contractor had received payment for all work completed up to that time, he had failed to use the funds in meeting his obligations on outstanding accounts to a number of firms for materials and supplies under the contract.

Further payments by the Crown to the contractor were with-held until the creditors advised the Department that they had appointed a receiver to act in their behalf, and in a letter dated October 23, 1947, bearing the signatures of all known creditors including your own, the Department was advised that Mr. H.C.K. Housser, 103-Fourth Avenue South, Port Alberni, had been appointed to act in that capacity.

You are doubtless aware, that the Crown recognizes the General Contractor only, on a project, and that sub-contractors or supply houses are responsible for protecting their own interests, insofar as their financial relations with the General Contractor are concerned. However, the prerogative held by the Department to pay funds due a General Contractor who has defaulted in his payment to creditors, directly to these creditors, through a receiver agreeable to the creditors, was followed, and following Mr. Housser's appointment with Power of Attorney for the creditors, all funds due Mr. Brown still under our control were paid directly to Mr. Housser for distribution, proportionate to the amount of the creditors' claims.

Under date of March 19, 1948, Mr. Housser advised this office that all funds had been distributed.

It is realized that under the circumstances, creditors were not paid in full, but Mr. Brown having been paid the greater proportion of his contract price directly, and the balance of the total contract price having been distributed to the creditors through their appointed receiver, the connection of the Department with the contract is now terminated. Any further recovery of funds by the creditors is dependent upon either mutually agreeable arrangements with Mr. Brown or by legal action against him.




Dear Mr. Arneil,

Mr. Gurney, the Engineer in charge of the recovering of the floors of the basement (work on which has been started) has recommended to his Department the further expenditure of \$300.00 to cover, under the same contract, the floors on the girls side of the basement, comprising the play room, drying room and wash room. The linoleum, which showed no sign of deterioration when the floor covering was estimated for, now is lifting and deteriorating in several places and will require to be renewed. The mastic tile being laid on the other parts of the basement floor appears to be a very satisfactory floor covering and would be similarly suitable for the area additional mentioned above.

The contractors will be finished with the area already arranged for about August 4th or 5th and it would be very desirable to have them continue with the work now requested.

Could I trouble you to make an urgent request for the additional appropriation?




