





Dear Sir:

I have included in this years estimates for repairs and new equipment, one Tailoring Sewing Machine for our Boys' Side. In the estimate I put in a price of \$84.00, but on consultation with the Singer Sewing Machine Company, their recommendation was for a 31-K-15 machine with a motor, the total cost to be \$113.

We have only one sewing machine on the Boys' Side, and the boys themselves are doing most of the mending of their own clothes. At present they do a great deal of sewing, patching, etc., by hand, but it is quite impossible to keep up with the demand. It is a fine thing that the boys are learning to look after their own clothes, but as I have said, there is such a volume of it that they ought to have equipment to take care of it. There will still be plenty of mending to be done by hand, but the surplus which has to remain over from week to week, would be gotten rid of if they had the machine we are asking for. Mr. Peake, our Boys Supervisor, is a tailor by trade, and it is owing to his oversight and training that the boys are able to do this work.

I would greatly appreciate it if the Department would see fit to honour our request. We have 125 boys, so that you will see a machine such as we are asking for would be quite in order.

Dear Mr. Hoey:

Many times throughout the year I have recalled your letter to me under date of May 5th, 1937, File 153-0-5 in which you stated that consideration was being given to the installation of two or three Moving Picture Equipments in some of the Schools. Once again I would like to bring before you our need of better facilities along this line. Our small 16 mm. Silent Machine has been in use a long time and before long will need either extensive repairs or renewal. Since my first letter, the library of 16 mm. films available for Schools has been largely increased, so that I am not now so much concerned, about a 35 mm. as compared with the 16 mm.

Last night Rev. A.R. Lett, Principal of St. George's School at Lytton, visited us enroute home from Vancouver, and gave us a very fine picture show, using his new Sound Machine, and this has increased my anxiety to secure some such equipment. I find that not only Companies carrying 16 mm. films for rental have increased their libraries, but Government Departments and University Extension groups and the Board of School Trustees of Vancouver have provided libraries which are available to Schools such as ours. The educational factor in the showing of these films is very strong. No amount of teaching or reading for instance, could have given to our children the conception of the Fraser Valley, the rolling country, mountains and lakes of the Interior from Lytton to Telkwa, B.C., as did the showing of Mr. Lett's films last evening.

In addition to the educational needs, there is still the need for providing recreation owing to the strict quarantine which we are placed under for nearly two thirds of the School Year. Between Measles in the School before Christmas, and the amount of Whooping Cough, Scarlet Fever and Chicken Pox in the surrounding community since Christmas,

we have been left to ourselves to provide for our childrens' needs. Again let me say that I feel the quarantine is amply justified, as the health of the School has been excellent since Christmas. With the exception of a few mild cases of Chicken-pox, we have had little or no sickness.

Hoping that Coqualeetza may be one of the schools favored with the installation which you have in mind, and assuring you of my willingness to cooperate in any reasonable scheme which the Department may evolve, I am,

With regard to the two fifty foot lengths of Fire Hose, I beg to say that the hose is an unlined woven pliable type, which folds flat in the holder on the hydrant. The couplings are brass with two lugs upon which we use a spanner, and there are five threads inside the coupling which seem to me to be the ordinary pipe thread. Please note that the size of the hose is one and one half inch and not one and one quarter inch as in my letter of March 15th.


