

Sir:

I wish to refer to Department Letter No. 133-0-5 dated October 27th, and to say that I have just received a letter from Dr. Doyle in which he states the amount of \$350. allowed for the erection of the chicken house would not permit of supplying all the doors for the north side of the school. One door is yet required, which will cost \$11.50. This is for the cold side of the school and certainly should be supplied.

Further in his letter Dr. Doyle points out that the roof of the kitchen on the stockman's residence needs re-shingling. The roof leaks badly and, in the interests of economy and usefulness, new shingles should be supplied. Dr. Doyle is willing to do the work if the Department will supply the shingles. These will cost approximately \$25.

The above are necessary repairs and I would appreciate having authority to arrange for the purchases.







Dear Sir:

A short while ago we ran a stack of sweet clover through the cutting box into the feed loft in the horse barn. We shortly noticed that the inside beam over the drive floor was sagging. This beam covers a space of 26 ft. and is supported by truss rods. A few days ago one of the turn-buckles broke on one side and the beam, which is just 10 inches square, began to crack. We relieved the strain by temporary posts and, as quickly as we could, secured the necessary posts and timber to make it safe.

As this was an emergency we were unable to consult you in regard to this expenditure and I am now enclosing the bill for Ten Dollars, Ninety Cents as Voucher #90 in favor of A. R. McDiarmid Limited.

Dear Sir:

Dr. Doyle, Principal of the Brandon Indian Residential School, is anxious to get started at his spring cleaning and wishes to paint the following rooms:

- Walls and ceilings for 3 classrooms
- Walls for Office and 5 staff rooms
- Walls and ceilings for main living room and 1 bedroom in bungalow
- Doors and general woodwork in school (varnish)
- One floor and some woodwork in gate house

The paint required will cost \$139.73 according to a quotation submitted by Johnson's Hardware Co. Ltd. Brandon.

Dr. Doyle states,-  
"We got an estimate from Mr. Hickling for the work in the bungalow, which was \$40.00. This seems high to us and if the Department would allow \$12.00 we could hire a man and with the aid of the boys could get this work done satisfactorily."

The boys need the training and I would recommend that they do the work and that \$12.00 be allowed to hire a foreman. The total expense will be \$151.73.

Parts of the buildings are in need of paint and if some work is carried out each year, we will be able to keep them in good condition. I would recommend that this expense be allowed and would appreciate having the necessary authority.


Dear Sir,-

The Department is in receipt of your 209-11A U. of the 24th instant, with reference to a request received from the Principal of the Brandon Indian Residential School for paint valued at \$139.73.

It will be necessary for you to let me have definite information regarding the quantities and colours of paint necessary, also the quantity and quality of the varnish. When this is received, the request will be placed before our Purchasing Agent. Incidentally, I might point out that, when applying in future, you should give complete information regarding what is required in order to save correspondence.

It is noted that Dr. Doyle mentions that the painting could be done by the boys under the charge of a foreman. Do you consider a foreman really necessary for the painting mentioned? It is felt that some member of the school staff should be able to supervise the boys when painting these rooms.

I beg to enclose herewith Voucher #95 in favor of Messrs. Yates, Neale & Company for Twenty-three Dollars, Sixty Cents (\$23.60), for clearing drain pipe to septic tank in connection with residence of Principal.

Before New Year the water supply here became inadequate and it did not rise in the house to the bathroom all winter and for the past two months or more it only occasionally came into the hot water tap in the kitchen. This meant that all our washing had to be done at the school and practically no hot water was turned into the sewer. The result was that the pipe froze up, commencing, no doubt, at the trap just before it enters the septic tank and backing up from there to the cellar. This accounts for the bill enclosed.


