

Sir:

I regret to inform you that since the Alberni School account was reported closed, another bill has come in from the B.C. Electric Railway Co., Victoria, dated January 29, 1936, for moving guy rope and installing transformer \$30.97. Upon investigation I find that there is also an account outstanding with the Alberni Machine Shops for machinist work. This account has not been presented, although I have written for it. The amount is estimated at between \$10. and \$15.00.

Also, owing to an omission in posting the Cash Book to the Ledger, a credit of \$2.92 did not appear in the latter. In consequence, when I reported a balance of \$2.54 on hand and suggested paying Mr. Tredcroft for three extra days service, from General Surveys funds, the balance in the Alberni Account should have been \$24.46.

When this correction was made the whole of Mr. Tredcroft's 3 days salary \$18.11, was charged to Alberni School, which leaves a balance of \$6.35 at credit of that account.

We still have to provide for the items mentioned in the first paragraph above amounting approximately \$45.00.

The concluding paragraph of the Indian letter to you dated December 30, 1935, "W.A.", reads:

"Work at the Alberni Indian Resid-

Sir:-

I have the honour to refer to your letter of April 8, 1936 re inspection of the Alberni Indian Residential School and to report that it would not be possible to use the present store room as a dormitory without making considerable structural alterations.

A re arrangement of the girl's dormitory has been suggested to the Reverend Principal and acted upon since receipt of your letter which will allow a cubic air space of 550 cubic feet per pupil.

This relieves the over crowding and it is respectfully submitted that except in case of a material increase in number of girl pupils the expense of alteration to the building would not be warranted.





The corresponding room on the boys' side is so used as a dormitory for the small boys. This prevents overcrowding on their side of the school. 



The Department has received a communication from the Principal of the Alberni Indian Residential School, requesting authority to incur the expenditure required in painting the shingled roof of the school building and carrying out painting and other repairs.

In this connection I have to inform you that the following amounts have been provided in our Appropriation for the current fiscal year:-

I would request that you will advise the Department how it is proposed to have the work carried out. Would it be satisfactory for you to arrange for the purchase of the paint and materials required and have the work done by day labour? You should state, also, what part, if any, of the painting, etc., could be carried out by the staff of the school and if it would be satisfactory to employ Indian labour for any work that the school staff is unable to perform. It might be more satisfactory to employ a competent foreman-painter, or it is possible that the Principal could oversee the work. In any event, the Department could not authorize any expense in excess of the amounts stated above. When we have full particulars, as requested, you will be further advised. The Principal is being informed that this matter has been referred to you for a report.


