

Re: Wood Furnace at the Round Lake Day School.

The furnace in the Round Lake Day School is an old #416A Famous Magnet manufactured by the McClary Co., Winnipeg, Manitoba., with a 4' 6" fire box. The fire box and the drums are all burnt out and is now beyond repair. This furnace has been patched up several times and has been unsatisfactory for several years. On real cold days last winter school had to be cancelled as the building could not be properly heated. A new furnace is urgently needed for the coming winter.

This item is in the 1941-42 estimates, would the Department purchase a new wood furnace with a 4' 6" fire box to heat this building containing 19200 cubic feet, consisting of 2 classrooms and cloakrooms.

The labour for the installation would be about \$20.00 plus any new material needed in connecting the present two hot and three cold air ducts. The nearest available tinsmith is Mr. F. Garland of Whitewood, Sask.

If possible this work should be done during the summer vacation, so that the school could be cleaned after the installation of the furnace. The school rooms were painted during the Easter vacation and are now black with the smoke from the old furnace.






