
I have to refer to Mr. Hoey's letter of September 21st wherein it is stated that the question of supplying material for the construction of a blacksmith shop at the Kootenay Indian Residential School should remain in abeyance for a time.

Mr. Indian Agent Irwin has forwarded the attached quotation from the Cranbrook Sash and Door Company, Limited, covering the materials required at a cost of \$296.39. If there are funds remaining in the Education Vote for the current fiscal year, it is recommended that authority be granted for the purchase of these materials in view of the fact that the other more urgent repairs at the School have now been carried out, with the exception of the painting of the roof and other parts of the exterior, which matter will be the subject of a separate communication.

I wish to enclose herewith quotation in duplicate from Patmore Bros., Cranbrook, amounting to \$382.45 covering the cost of labour and repairs needed for the furnace at the Kootenay Indian Residential School. I may say that part of this work is already done. Mr. Patmore was asked on several occasions to check on the repairs needed and submit a quotation and when at last he got down to the School the Rev. Principal Forbes urged him to get busy immediately on the job.

The teachers and children were catching cold for want of heat. Because of a volume of work with which Mr. Patmore can not cope for want of help, the Principal insisted on his starting on the job when he had a few days to spare, believing as he did that he would have a lot of hospital cases on his hands if the School remained any longer without heat.



I enclose letter dated 29th. Ult. addressed to you by
Mr. Irwin with reference to repairs to school furnace amounting
to \$ 382.45.

I have interviewed Father Forbes and apparently the
breakdown in the furnace had not been anticipated and occurred
during the middle of the Winter, and had to be carried out
immediately.

The remedy for occurrences of this kind is a thorough
check over of the school installations at the close of the school
year, in order that necessary replacements may be anticipated
and provided for. I have advised Father Forbes accordingly, and
also that work of this kind must not be undertaken without first
referring the order to this office. It is possible that the
Department may wish to hold the account until the end of the Fiscal
year.

The above would also refer to the enclosed quotation
for \$ 38.40 for parts supplied to the furnace, brought to your
attention by Mr. Irwin on the 29th. Ult, his letter being enclosed
herewith. I am asking Mr. Patmore to furnish me with an account
in this connection. It will be noted that I have had Father Forbes
endorse the quotation as having received the material.



I enclose herewith a letter dated February 6th from Mr. Indian Agent Irwin, and quotation referred to therein, covering the supply of nails, paint, hinges, etc., for the Kootenay Indian Residential School. In the absence of Mr. Irwin, this matter was referred to Inspector Coleman for further information with respect to the necessity for these items. Mr. Coleman informs me that this hardware, etc., is required in connection with the construction of the blacksmith shop at the school and will be additional to the expenditure of \$296.39 authorized in Departmental letter 155-0-5 of February 14th.

Mr. Coleman states that he intends visiting the school with the Provincial School Inspector in the near future, at which time the question of the blacksmith shop, if a division of the manual training of the school, would then become a matter of discussion in correlation to the other school activities. It is recommended that if funds are available at this time authority be granted for the purchase of the materials listed at a cost of \$27.45, as the school will then be in a position to proceed with the construction of the building which will provide useful training for the children in farm blacksmithing.

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

Following Mr. Phelan's letter of August 31st authorizing the purchase of a new kitchen range for the Kootenay Indian Residential School, we have had considerable correspondence with the late Indian Agent and the Principal of the School with a view to establishing the definite need for a new range. As Mr. Irwin, the Principal and the Reverend Sisters at the School were of different opinions, the matter was left in abeyance until Inspector Coleman reached Cranbrook.

A recent letter from Mr. Coleman indicates that it would be advisable to replace the range, but Gordon & Belyea Ltd. are unable to promise delivery until some time in April. It would appear, therefore, that the matter must be left in abeyance until the coming fiscal year, and I would request that authority be granted for the purchase of a new range at that time at a cost of \$388.50, f.o.b. warehouse, Vancouver, B.C.; this amount to include a high shelf and galvanized water coil.

schools, we have been supplying a kitchen range No.
L.H. 224-1, General Steel Wares. This has a high
closet but no reservoir. There are two ovens and
the range burns either coal or wood. The approximate
size is 77 x 31 - left-handed feed. We can secure
this type of stove at a much more reasonable price
than that quoted in your letter and I think it should
fill the requirements at the Kootenay School. Please
let me hear further from you, and if you agree that
this type would be suitable, we can place the order.



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

Replying to your letter of the 19th instant, file 155-0-5, with reference to the replacement of the kitchen range at the Kootenay Indian Residential School, I would advise that the writer has just returned from Cranbrook and while there checked over the present installation, discussing it with the Reverend Principal and the Reverend sister in charge of the kitchen operations. The Reverend Principal, while not very definite, was inclined to the opinion that the range in use functions satisfactorily enough for their requirements with which opinion the Reverend Sister was definitely in disagreement. After looking over the unit while in operation, I am of the opinion it is not functioning properly but that the cause lies outside of the range itself. On the other hand, the unit is getting pretty old and it will only be a matter of a year or two before it requires replacement.

Much of the trouble at this school with mechanical and other installations is that their maintenance and arrangement is entrusted to an individual, Mr. Townsend, described as the School Engineer who, in my opinion, usually succeeds in impairing their usefulness by his "improvements" on the original design, and that this is what has given rise to the continual difficulty with the school engines and the range. In this instance, he has "improved" on the manufacturer's design by installing an auxiliary chimney and also ventilating a very large canopy into the chimney itself, thus crippling its draft.


I am of the opinion that the range suggested by you, No. 224-1, General Steel Wares, is large enough for the purposes of this school and would recommend that it be supplied

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conditionally that it be installed by a competent person outside of the school staff and that the canopy be ventilated through one of the windows which could be effected by replacing one of the window panes by a sheet of galvanized iron with a hole cut to permit the pipe passing through and extending about a foot or 18 inches beyond the opening. As the school is of concrete construction, there would be practically no danger of fire. A right hand stove would be preferable to the left hand suggested, if this is obtainable. Stove pipe may be required but could be made up locally if necessary.
