Dear Sir:

I regret to report that a fire occurred recently in the engine and boiler room at the Round Lake Residential School, causing damage to two doors and transom and the paint in the passage and laundry. Two doors and frames will have to be replaced and the laundry and passage painted.

In its present state the boiler and engine room is a fire hazard. While it is not practical to change the present arrangements of the boiler room, much of the danger would be eliminated if the interior were lined with Gyproc, which is a fireproof material.





Dear Sir:

We have received a communication from Mr. A. Kendrick, Marieval, Sask., with reference to the electric light system at the Round Lake Residential School, Whitewood, Sask., in which he writes as follows:

"After making a final inspection of the Round Lake Indian School electric light system, I find that they have not got a cutout on the switch board, and any time the engine might stop when there is no attendant around, the batteries will discharge through the generator, running the generator as a motor. Not only does this prove harmful to the batteries due to the high rate of discharge, but also might injure the generator."

OK
"It would cost \$10.60 to install an automatic cutout with the proper type designed for that load."



While here he made the following request. At the Round Lake School there is no Chapel and the present arrangement is to hold Church in the classrooms of the school, which are in a separate building from the main school building. To provide seating accommodation it is necessary to carry out benches that are used by the children in the dining room and the Principal was wondering whether our Branch would furnish him with collapsible chairs. He claims these would cost \$2.25 each and could be piled up in the back end of the school during the week and set up to be used for Sunday Church Service. Mr. Huston wants 100 chairs, which would mean \$225.00.

If our Branch will not agree to this Mr. Huston would like to know if he could be given a grant and he would take up a collection amongst the employees and donate something himself for the purpose of getting the chairs in question.


