The Board had under consideration a memorandum from the Superintendent General of Indian Affairs reporting that a small bungalow being necessary for staff accommodation at the Sechelt Indian Boarding School recently erected in British Columbia, plans and specifications were prepared in accordance with sketches furnished the Department of Indian Affairs by the principal of the school and tenders were asked for, for the erection of this building, and that the following have been received:

Johnson Brothers, Sechelt,	\$ 2,660.00
Baynes & Horrie, Vancouver,	2,997.00
James Layfield Construction Co., Ltd., Vancouver	3,000.00
D. J. Lavewek, Vancouver,	3,328.00

The Superintendent General recommends, pursuant to the requirements of Sub-section 2 of Section 56 of the Public Works Act that the contract be awarded to the lowest tenderers, Johnson Brothers, for the amount of their tender as above cited, namely, \$2,660.00, the same being reported by the Architect of the Department as fair and reasonable, and money being available from the Vote for Indian Education.
