FARM EQUIPMENT: - pages 8 & 9. Of the items not yet sent he directs special attention to the urgent need of the barbed wire (12 rolls, double strand, and 50 lbs. long staples. This is required for cross fences and should be ordered without any further delay, also material for a hay rake. May I suggest that you authorize your Indian Agent (by telegram) to purchase the material for the hay rack, lumber, iron fittings, etc., also barbed wire and staples.





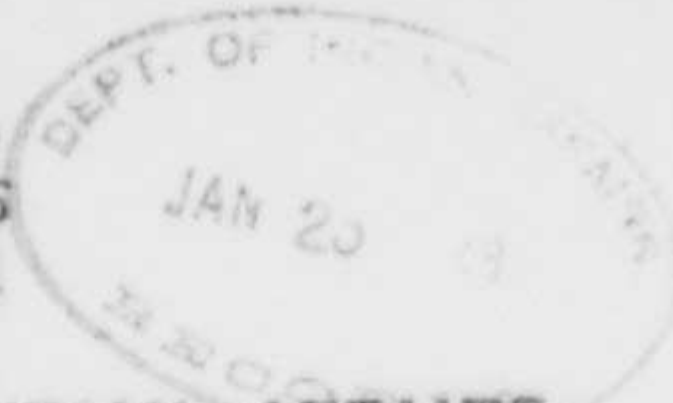

Sir,

I have received a letter from the Rev. T.P.R. Westgate at Winnipeg, asking if the Department would consider granting assistance to the St. Cyprian School at Brocket, Alberta, by providing ten cows of good milking strain. He points out that the new school has a capacity of fifty pupils, but is about fifteen short of the capacity enrollment and that as a consequence the cost of maintenance is resting heavily on the Church.

You will recall that we have granted similar assistance to schools on the Flood and Morley Reserves, and to the Church of England School at Union Lake. If the Department will sanction the purchase of the animals required at the St. Cyprian School, I will take the necessary steps to arrange for their purchase to the best possible advantage.


Sir:

Dear Mr. Graham:

W. J. O.
I have the honour to report that during my recent trip to Alberta and while at the Peigan agency I called at the two residential schools on the reserve.

x x x

At the Anglican school everything seemed to be in fair shape also. The school was clean and tidy and matters in general seemed to be running along smoothly. When I was at Hobbema I received a wire from you instructing me to purchase five cows for the school, which I did. I may say that at the present time it is a very difficult matter to buy milch cows. I was in touch with most of the stockmen in Alberta and the only place I could find any cows was at the C.P.R. farm at Strathmore. The cows which I bought are Holstein. They are not pedigreed; two of them are pure bred but have no papers and the other three are practically pure bred. All have passed the tuberculin test and two of them had just freshened, while the other three are due to freshen around the end of this month. The price paid for these cows was \$125.00 each, which I consider very reasonable. They are from three to six years of age and if properly looked after will produce a lot of milk.

Dear Sir:-

During a visit to our St. Cyprian School yesterday, I noted the very urgent need of a pair of bob-sleighs and undertook to ascertain if your Department would provide these. I regret that I was unable to confer with Mr. Indian Agent Arthur on this matter, as he was seriously ill with three Doctors in consultation and a surgical operation appeared to be imperative, but I feel certain he would confirm my opinion of the necessity of the sleighs. The snow lies deep on all the country side of Southern Alberta, and as a carload of coal is now on order for this School and must be off-loaded at once, and the coal drawn to the School, the urgent necessity of the sleighs is apparent. As the wagon-box will fit the sleighs, the cost should not be much for the bobs alone, and I shall be obliged if you will either undertake to provide these or authorize me to do so. A grain-cleaner or fanning mill will also be required before Spring seeding begins, but I will address a separate communication to you at a later date in this connection.
