

## MEMORANDUM

Department of Indian Affairs,

Ottawa, 3<sup>rd</sup> March 1892.

With ref. to the Rev. Mr. Wilson's letter of the 27<sup>th</sup> ult. relative to the part of the grant to the Shingwan & Warranash Homes being made on the average daily attendance at these institutions I beg to report that the same system is being applied to the Mikwemung & Mount Elgin institutions.

At Mikwemung the average attendance invariably exceeds the number of pupils covered by the grant, and the same may be said of the Mount Elgin institution.

For the year ended the 30<sup>th</sup> June last the average at the Mikwemung Inst. was 43 & 30 pupils were paid for & at the Mount Elgin Inst. for the same period the average was 81 & 80 pupils were paid for.

With regard to his contention in the closing part of his letter to the effect that the daily average attendance shown on the Returns does not represent the average attendance at the Inst. &c I think they should show the average

*I have to acknowledge your letter of the 11<sup>th</sup> Nov. (No. 74138) (forwarded to me to B.C. & returned to me here). informing me that a grant has been allowed of \$1100 towards repairs &c. at the Shingwauk & Wawanosh & \$900 for fire protection as applied for in my letter to the Dep<sup>y</sup> of Dec<sup>r</sup>. 24/91. I will lay the matter before our Indian Homes Comtee at our next meeting. It seems to me that we shall have to ask for extension of time beyond June 30<sup>th</sup> - as outdoor work cannot commence before the first week in May. Dick will allow about 2 months for the completion of the work. This will cause additional expense, & prevent our making that use of the Indian boys' labor which we could have done had more time been allowed.*

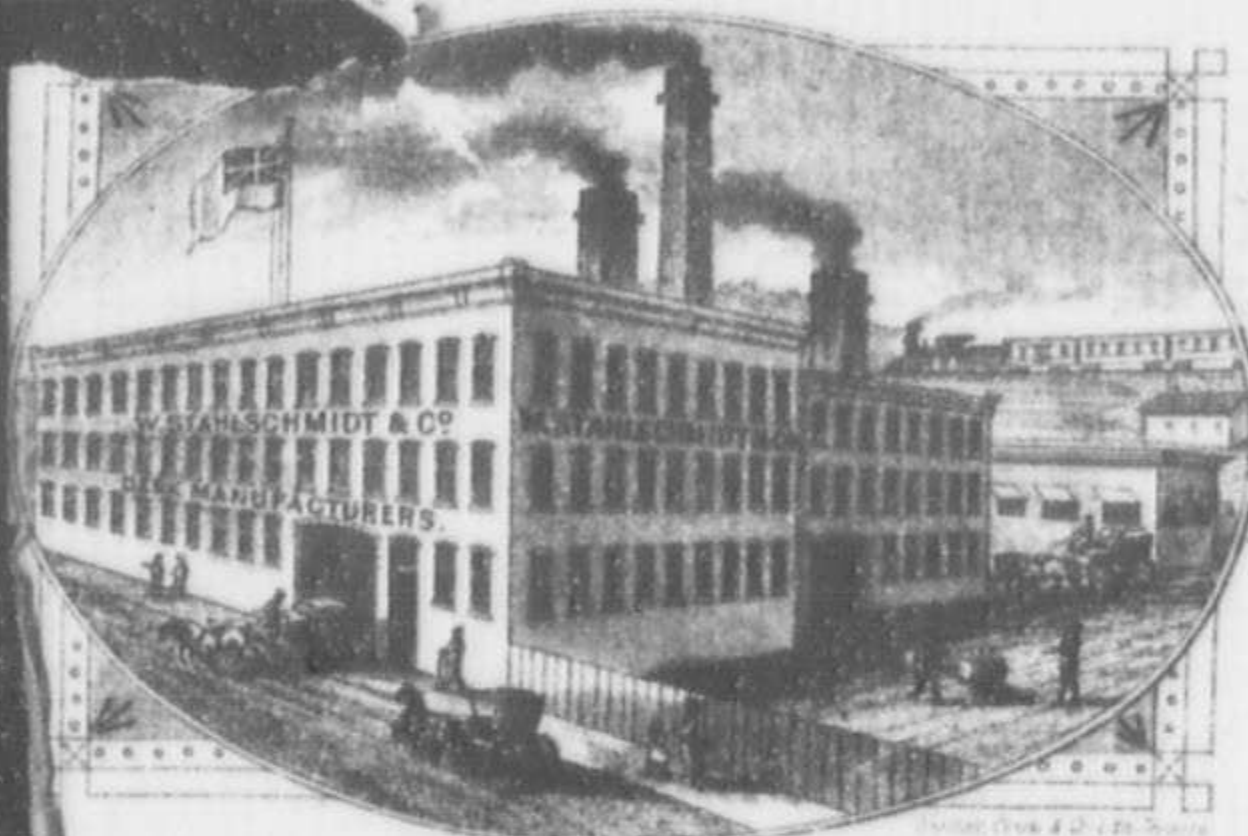
