

RE: MOTOR for Return Pump for Furnaces.

Dear Sir:

For some time the motor which is part of the Return Pump unit for our furnaces has been sparking. We had an electrician check it. He said that there was nothing out of the ordinary except that it probably needed cleaning. Soon afterwards, it stopped and we had it fixed, thinking that it was only something that would come under "operational expenses".

As it was summer, we did not have it installed until the last week of August. The wiring, including the armature, burned out. We found then that the bearings were binding.

The electricians and motor experts in Winnipeg said that the motor was wearing out from ~~long~~ use.

The motor has to be entirely re-wound, (including armature,) and the bearings must be replaced.

Since the children are now back and we must use the furnace for washing and for laundry, and also for heating the buildings on account of the unseasonable weather, it is absolutely essential that we have the return pump in operation immediately.

Because of its urgency, I have thought it advisable to ask the Electrician to proceed with the necessary work, keeping the price as low as possible. The total expenses will be approximately \$75.00

I submit this above information, along with a letter from the electrician, hoping that the Department will agree to the urgency and will see fit to authorize the payment of this account.





Dear Sirs: Re - Gasoline Tax, Cecilia Jeffrey Indian School, Kenora.

For some time we have had a problem on our hands which you may be able to clear up for us very easily.

In the past, we have been allowing sales of gasoline to the Cecilia Jeffrey Presbyterian Indian School at Kenora, Ont. to be made gasoline tax exempt. Occasionally we have received letters from the Gasoline Tax Branch of the Dept. of Highways, Toronto, that no confirmation for these sales had been forwarded from the Dept. of Mines & Resources, Indian Affairs Branch, at Ottawa and advising at the same time that the gasoline tax be charged. Some times we have made sales of gasoline to this Indian School, gasoline tax exempt, which have gone unnoticed by the Gasoline Tax Branch as we have not had any letter advising us to charge the tax in every case. What we would like to know is, should we allow sales to be made to the Cecilia Jeffrey Indian School, Gasoline Tax exempt. Also, if this Indian School is gasoline tax exempt, do we allow it on the invoice covering the sale, or do they make an application at the end of the year for a refund of the gasoline tax.

We have written both the Indian Agent at Kenora and the Principal of the Cecilia Jeffrey Indian School, but neither of these parties have been able to help us in this matter. If you could settle this matter for us, we assure you that it would be very greatly appreciated as we should like to know the proper method of handling the sales.

We thank you in anticipation of an early reply, and for your co-operation in this matter.

Dear Sir:

Our Hot water tank has sprung a leak. It is one of about 600 gals. with a steam coil inside, through which steam from the boilers heats the water for the school.

Inspector Kelly evidently warned our engineer a few years ago that the boiler might go soon through corrosion.

We sought professional advise and were told of a certain flanged plug, which, it was stated would stop the leak. This may do a temporary job. We will try it to night.

However we are informing you of this incident because it may mean that the entire inside of the tank is corroded and weak. If it should go, 60 lbs. of hot water might be serious.

Also, our Steam dryer has developed a leak. We think that this may be in one of the tubes at the back which carry the steam (about 90 lbs. However we have been unable to get a steam fitter to check this. One will do so to-morrow. If the trouble is serious, I will let you know.
