Dear Sir:

Yesterday Mr. Ames, formerly of Ames & Baker of this City called to enquire if we desired to disposed of the Windmill and Darrick and I told him I would write you immediately.

The windmill is not in use now and I cannot see that any emergency might arise which would make it practicable to use it. In very windy weather when the wind is from the north, especially, the mill continues to turn a good deal and the derrick is leaning out of plumb to the south. Mr. Ames says the most he could offer is \$35.00.

It seems to me as it is deteriorating in value it would be best to dispose of it. If this meets with your approval I would be glad if you could see fit to add this amount to the \$175.00 you have set apart to be spent this year on the fixing up of the grounds around the School.

I might say that we have our teams busy whenever possible doing some necessary grading at the west side of the School and at the back.



Dear Sir:

After ten months of occupation of this splendid new School and doing our best to care for food stuffs we find that some sort of a cooling system or frigidaire equipment is necessary for the store room for food. This room as you know, while insulated with four inches of cork has no means of either ventilation or keeping the air cool. Placing a tub of ice in the room has practically no effect, as it can only be placed near the floor and the air does not circulate.

When Dr. Scott was here last autumn he asked me to get estimates on the cost of frigidaire equipment and submit the same to the Department. And that he would urge that this matter receive attention immediately after the opening of the new fiscal year. I have secured tenders from the Imperial Motors of this City and also of Mitchell's Hardware Limited and enclose them herewith.


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

The appropriation for improvements at Indian schools was so seriously cut, that the Department will have to postpone consideration until it is determined whether or not a supplementary estimate is to be secured.

Dear Sir:

When the old school building was being wrecked about two years ago the bell was broken in getting it down and since opening the new school we have tried to get along without the use of a big bell but we find it very unsatisfactory. I am, therefore, herewith applying for a big bell to be placed somewhere on the building.

I have consulted Christie's as to the size of bell usually sold for purposes of this kind and find that bell #24 on page 58 of their Catalogue #40 is recommended by them. And that is approximately the size of our old bell. The price is \$48.50. There would be some additional expense for material to build a suitable tower in which to house it. But I think the work on this would be done by our mechanic with the assistance of the boys.

The advisability of placing the bell in front of the school just within the oval, which we contemplate laying out will also be considered. The cost of placing it there would be a little greater as a cement platform should be made on which to erect the frame for it.
