
Dear Sir:

I am in receipt of your letter of the 9th ultimo with reference to certain work performed by Mr. Harvey M. Davis at the Mount Elgin Indian Residential School, Muncey Indian Reserve.

There was some delay in completing payment for the work done by Mr. Davis due to the fact that the accounts were incorrectly prepared and finally we were obliged to send our engineer to the school to check the work which he had done.

It was finally decided that a reasonable amount to allow him would be \$2,750.97. A payment of \$2,500.00 was made to Mr. Davis in January, 1937, and a cheque for the balance, namely \$250.97, was sent to him on May 11, 1937. There is no further balance due him in connection with this work.

Please find enclosed Agent's Report respecting Mount Elgin Indian Residential School for the month of May.

While the management of this school is quite satisfactory, the Principal stresses the need of some repairs and alterations and asks that a properly equipped infirmary for handling sick pupils be constructed. This need has been reported to the Department on previous occasions.

The Principal also asks that a sum in the vicinity of \$300.00 be made available for the necessary repairs to a farm house located on the school grounds which has been empty for about three years and which Mr. Strapp now finds necessary to occupy for a further employee to take the place of John Kapayo who is off duty from chronic illness and is occupying the quarters which would be otherwise used by the employee appointed to replace him.

The verandas at the main building need considerable repair and all exterior wood work badly needs painting and the sum in the vicinity of \$250.00 would be needed to do this work.

The Principal also asks for the installation of a walk-in refrigerator, estimated cost \$800.00, claiming that at present he has to purchase all meats and has no method of keeping the same and that if a refrigerator were installed he would be able to raise and butcher for his own use the meat necessary for the school and in this manner provide meat more often to the pupils from the saving made.

I am in receipt of your letter of the 3rd instant with reference to requests made to you by the Principal of the Mount Elgin Indian Residential School.

In preparing our appropriation for the current fiscal year it was only found possible to include an amount of \$1000.00 for repairs, improvements and new equipment at the Mount Elgin Residential School during the current fiscal year. The present set up of our appropriation makes it practically impossible for us to exceed the amount that was specially provided for this school.

You should, therefore, consult the Principal again and ascertain in what manner he wishes the amount provided, namely \$1000.00, expended.

In the event of it being necessary to purchase any material or equipment complete details should be given as all purchases are now made by the Purchasing Agent and he requires details to assist him in making purchases.

With reference to your letter 7-0-5 of June 7th containing the information that the sum of \$1000.00 was available for improvements and new equipment at Mount Elgin Residential School, I would advise that Mr. Strapp, Principal of this school has obtained a quotation from the Kelvinator of Canada Ltd., London, Ont., which is enclosed, for the supplying of a walk-in refrigerator at the school which cost amounts to \$609.50. This price does not include electrical wiring or manual control box which would make an extra in the vicinity of \$25.00 to \$35.00.



Dear Sir: Attention Mr. Philip Phelan.

With further reference to your letter 7-0-5 of June 7th, I would advise that Mr. Strapp, Principal of Mount Elgin School, has obtained and submitted to this office an estimate of the carpenter work and decorating work he wishes done at Mount Elgin Residential School and which, when completed, would be chargeable to the \$1000.00 available for repairs and improvements at this school.

As Mr. Strapp is now on three weeks vacation, I am unable to give you itemized requisitions but Mr. Drake, the carpenter who did repair work at this school last year, estimates the carpenter work at \$52.00 including material and labour.

Mr. Howard Wilton, paper-hanger and painter whom Mr. Strapp has previously engaged for work there, estimates the papering and painting required by Mr. Strapp at \$110.00, including material and labour.

If possible, I would ask that authority be granted for this work to be done by these men who are now engaged in the erection of the new Oneida # 1 School, Mr. Drake being the contractor and Mr. Wilton doing the decorating and they could do the work at Mount Elgin upon completion of the new school and it is practically impossible to submit itemized requisitions of the materials needed for these small and numerous repairs.





I would acknowledge receipt of your letter 7-0-5 of October 1st enclosing account submitted by John A. Drake, Strathroy, Ontario, for materials and labour at Mount Elgin Residential School amounting to \$104.31 on which you ask for further information.

When Mr. Drake compiled his estimate at the request of the Rev. Principal it was for repairs to be made on a dwelling house formerly occupied by one of the staff which had been vacant for a number of years and was in a bad state of repair. This estimate was forwarded to the Department through this office on August 18th and was satisfactory to the Principal but after Mr. Drake had commenced work it was found instead of needing only 150 brick to fix the chimneys it required 400 and extra labour and the chimneys had to be rebuilt completely.

In estimating the plastering needing repair, Mr. Drake only estimated patching whereas it was found that practically all the old plaster had to be removed and fresh plaster applied. Mr. Drake was also short in his estimate of the needs of locks on the doors of this dwelling nearly all of which had to be replaced with new locks.


