



I have the honour to submit herewith extract from a letter recently received from the Rev. E. V. Bird, Principal of Mackay Indian Residential School, The Pas, Manitoba which speaks for itself, and deals with the subjects contained in your letters No. 128-1-5 of February 2nd and 23rd last:-

"I wonder if you would kindly draw the attention of the Indian Department to the fact that the Farm-workshop has not been rebuilt, it should be done ere the winter comes. There is also the Laundry equipment, are they going to instal a Cylindrical Washer and extractor, these are sadly needed.

The Agent informed me that a contract will be let to build a road across the bay so that there will be a proper road to get to the School from the river, instead of going two miles to the end of the Creek and having to leave our canoes and engine where people passing can interfere with them. This will also save eight miles on a round trip".

THIS is a very strongly constructed washer, built for heavy duty. The material throughout is of the best grade and no pains have been spared to produce a machine that can be relied upon to give many years of satisfactory service.

The Main Trunion Journals operate in roller bearings. Less power is required to drive the machine and wear is almost entirely eliminated, with the result that all gears are always in correct mesh and alignment. Broken gears, worn trunion journals and bearing replacements are never necessary on this washer. The main bearings are entirely separated from the tub by packed stuffing boxes, which absolutely prevents oil and grease from entering the washer or water from coming out.

The Reversing Movement is our Beaver Ball Bearing type in which all the thrust of operating the belt shifter slides is taken by hardened steel balls. The movement is designed so as to give a positive even shifting of the belts, irrespective of wear, so that the

cylinder runs the same number of revolutions in either direction. The gears are machine cut from solid blanks and the main gear is thirty inches in diameter. The gear has a split hub to facilitate easy removal. A combined gear lock and hand wheel is provided.

The Cylinder is of the best grade all heart stock long-leaf yellow pine with hard Maple ribs. The three lifting ribs are extra deep to ensure rapid washing. The trunions are bolted to heavy brass rings. The hinges are of brass bolted through a brass batten with an enclosed brass lock.

The Outer Case is of the finest clear Cypress and is furnished with a brass apron at the door opening. Inspection plates are provided in each end so that trunion bolts may be tightened without removing the upper half of the case.

The Inlet and Outlet Tees are connected by a 1½ inch pipe into which steam can be injected. When steam is being used to heat the water this construction gives a rapid circulation and absolutely prevents any steam from coming in contact with the wood of the cylinder or case. The water inlet is 2 inches in diameter. The steam inlet is ¾ inch. A 3 inch plug type discharge valve is supplied.

This Washer can be arranged for motor drive, in which case it is driven from the motor through short belts. The motor is carried on a substantial cast iron base bolted firmly to the frame of the machine.

At a small additional cost these machines may be equipped with a Beaver 6 inch foot operated discharge valve, Beaver Water Level Indicator, visible anywhere in the wash room, Beaver Soap and Soda filling doors, and Monel Metal Lifting Ribs in the cylinder.



THE Wide Square Base distributes the weight over a large area, and allows this Machine to be operated at higher speeds than is possible with a small or round base.


