The account which you forwarded for the advanced educational grant of \$50 for the academic year 1934-35 is being paid, and a cheque will reach you in the near future.

It has been decided to allow this girl to continue her high school work during the current academic year, and the advanced educational grant will be allowed for her.

However, at the end of June, next, a report should be obtained from the Principal of the High School which she attends giving full particulars regarding her work during the academic year 1935-36. You should forward this to the Department, and a decision will then be made regarding what assistance, if any, can be allowed for her for the academic year 1936-37.

On July 25th the results of the June Provincial High School Entrance Tests were published in the Vancouver Daily Province. It will no doubt be of interest to the Department to learn that very satisfactory marks were obtained by the great majority of the Indian children writing this examination. In all sixteen candidates passed the High School Test from our schools. Only three or four failed to obtain the necessary 360 marks out of 600 required for a pass to High School. The highest mark made this year in the Entrance Examination was 543 by a pupil from the North Vancouver City Schools. The marks made by successful

Dear Mr. Hives:-

With reference to your recent visit to the Department at which time you stated that there were three pupils of the St. George's Residential School who were attending high school in the town of Lytton this year, their names should be retained on the quarterly return. In addition, we will allow an advanced educational grant of \$75. for each of them.

At the end of September you may forward us a voucher for \$22.50. This voucher should read:

"Advanced educational grant for (give names and register number of pupils) for the month of September.

Three pupils at \$7.50 each----- ----\$22.50"

At the end of the other three quarters of the current academic year you may apply for a payment of \$67.50 covering the three month period. At the end of June, 1948, you should submit a report regarding the progress they make during the current academic year.
